

CLARK ENSURES CARDIFF POINT

Luton 2 Cardiff 2

There was too much beef in Luton's shooting, and this fault, in the main, cost them a point after they had twice been ahead and done the bulk of the attacking, writes **Trevor Williamson**.

Credit Cardiff, though, for the way they stuck to their task—especially Brian Clark, who made the first and scored the second equaliser 10 minutes from time when the home cover was up in support of the attack.

All the Luton forwards were guilty of dissipating opportunities, and their shooting was on a par with the Red Indians' in a second-rate Western.

Anderson took his goal (24 minutes) well, Phillips—a fine player—equalised following the corner forced by Clark, and Givens put Luton ahead again from a penalty after he had been unnecessarily brought down in the box.

Cardiff's thick blue line, though they were often in attack, soaked up the massive Luton pressure and the little touch of luck that favours the brave enabled them to emerge with a valuable point.
