RLUES, after looking as if they were going to run Luton off their feet in the first 15 minutes at St. Andrew's, met unexpectedly stiff resistance.

Although dominating play for long stretches in the first half and forcing corner after corner, they were unable to break through Luton's resolute defence

Keith Barber brought off firstclass saves from Bob Latchford and Alan Campbell, while Trevor Francis shot wide with a great chance and Bob Hatton hit the post in the dying seconds of the half.

Blues kept up the pressure in the second half, but Luton continued to defend gallantly.

Carroll failed a fitness test and Page took his place at right-back. Smith was introduced for Page at No. 4.

Blues maintained an almost constant attack in the opening minutes and Taylor, operating down the right, caused the Luton defence a great deal of trouble.

Bob Latchford looked to have way line as Blues forced corner an opportunity, but he took time after corner. to get the bouncing ball under control and John Ryan dispos-sessed him and passed back for Barber to clear.

Blues saw to it that Taylor got plenty of the ball and, from another well-flighted cross, Pendrey had a possible chance. He got his toe under the ball and ballooned it high over the bar from the edge of the box.

The first real chance of the match fell to Francis who found himself in a splendid shooting position after Garner had taken the ball off Latchford's toe. Francis, a little over-anxious, shot too hurriedly and drove a yard wide.

Taylor was giving Shanks, Luton's teenage left-back, the runaround. From yet another of his centres Latchford almost scored with an overhead kick. Barber diving to his right to bring off a great save.

Luton were penned in their own half for the first 15 minutes and Dave Latchford touched the ball for the first time when he came out to handle a long free-kick from Shanks.

## Brilliant

The Luton goalkeeper saved brilliantly when Campbell dribbled through and shot accurately for the far corner.

Blues, going flat out for a goal. maintained an almost constant barrage of shots and centres, but somehow they could not find a way past Luton's massed defence.
