We take this opportunity to wish all our supporters a very happy Easter. It is some years since we have had a home fixture on a Good Friday, the last time, according to our records was on the 9th April 1965 when we defeated Potsmouth 4—1. Orritt, Gibson and Irvine (2) were the scorers.

Although we have still 8 league matches to play, the local and National Press have written us off for promotion. They seem to have forgotten that we still have to meet Norwich City and Birmingham City and that 7 points only separate the first 6 teams in Division 2. Whilst we would not minimise the enormity of the task of pulling back 7 points at this stage of the season — it is not impossible. Whilst some may say our performances of late do not suggest promotion, at this crucial time we feel that every encouragement should be afforded the team in their efforts to achieve this object.

Our junior team playing for the Northern Intermediate league goes from strength to strength. Last Saturday, a fine 2—0 victory over League Leaders Sunderland has put us within 4 points of the top position with two games in hand. They are also engaged in the semi-final of the League Cup, and meet Newcastle United on the 8th April (at Hutton Road) and play the second leg at Newcastle the following week. We are sure they will give a very good account of themselves.

Our visitors Luton Town, have over the last year or two been engaged in some very big transfer deals, notably the transfer of Malcolm MacDonald to Newcastle United and more recently Chris Nicholl to Aston Villa. Although this has undoubtedly weakened their team they are still a force to be reckoned with. We welcome them to Ayresome Park.

Gordon Jones who has played in his 499th league, F.A. Cup and Football League Cup game today, hopes to make his 500th appearance at Blackpool on Monday. His appearances for Boro' are only exceeded by those of the late Tim Williamson who played 561 games.

LUTON TOWN

Following a magnificent run which lifted them from the Fourth into the Second Division, the club is now faced with stringent economies which has necessitated their selling star men Malcolm Macdonald (to Newcastle for £180,000) and Chris Nicholl (to Villa for £75,000). Luton's team for today will probably be selected from:

Keith Barber (Goalkeeper). Keith joined Luton from Dunstable Town last season and, after playing three games last term, is currently holding down the first-team spot.

John Ryan (Right back). Fulham gave John his chance in their League eleven during the 1967/68 season. Luton signed him during the following campaign and he formed a vital link in the side which gained promotion from the Third Division.

Alan Slough (Left back). A Luton discovery who was introduced to the senior side when it was in the Fourth Division in 1965/66. Alan won a permanent place the following season and was a prominent player in both the Hatters' recent promotion seasons.

Don Shanks (Left back). Don, who signed professional for Luton in July 1970, made his League debut for them at Preston in August, held his place for several weeks and has now returned again after a spell in the reserves.

Mike Keen (Right half). Mike was a member of the Q.P.R. team which rose from the Third to the First Division and played in their 1967 League Cup winners' team. When manager Alec Stock left to go to Luton, Mike followed him.

Alan Garner (Centre half) Chris Nicholl's transfer has given Alan the chance to play in the first-team for the first time since his transfer from Millwall in 1971.

John Moore (Left half). Luton signed John from Motherwell six years ago and he missed only seven League games in his first three seasons at Kenilworth Road.

Jim Ryan (Outside right). Jim developed in soccer's top academy at Manchester United. He couldn't oust the big names on a permanent basis so when Luton made an offer for him in April 1970 he was happy to step down a rung.

David Court (Inside right). David developed in Arsenal's junior sides and stepped into their League team in 1962/63. There were many occasions when he held a regular place in the Gunners' side and he played for them in the 1969 League Cup final. Luton signed him in the 1970 close-season.

Peter Anderson (Centre forward). Peter made an extraordinarily quick rise from amateur circles into the League spotlight in February 1971. He was playing for Isthmian Leaguers Hendon when manager Alec Stock signed him and immediately promoted him to the League team.

Vic Halom (Centre forward). Luton paid Fulham £30,000 for Vic in September. Charlton gave him his first chance in League football in 1965/66 but he didn't often get into their senior side. Orient signed him in 1967 and two years later collected £35,000 when he moved to Fulham.

Viv Busby (Inside left). A Luton discovery, Viv got a few games in the League team two years ago but hit top form with one five goal hit in six games last season. Newcastle were interested in signing him this season and he spent some weeks on loan to them.

Don Givens (Outside left). Don won two international caps before making his League debut for Manchester United two seasons ago. He signed for Luton in April 1970 and was the Hatters' second-highest scorer with 13 goals last season. He now has 11 caps.

Spotlight on Today's Manager

ALEC STOCK (Luton Town)

ALEC STOCK, the manager, first hit the headlines in 1948 when he steered Southern League Yeovil Town to astonishing Cup victories over Bury and Sunderland.

In August 1949 he was appointed manager of Leyton Orient and built the side which won promotion to Division II in 1956. He moved to Arsenal as assistant manager in 1956 but he was greatly disillusioned by conditions on the coaching side at Highbury so he returned to Orient within a couple of months. The challenge of Italian soccer was

laid before him and he took control of Roma F.C. but once again returned to Leyton Orient when they were in trouble.

Alec Stock finally severed his connections with Orient in March 1959 and three months later became manager of Queens Park Rangers, whose success under his able command was phenomenal. They won the League Cup and rose from the Third to the First Division.

He left Rangers in November 1968 and shortly afterwards took over at Luton.



On entering Blackpool — on Preston New Road proceed as far as the roundabout, taking the road which will be ahead of you - this will be Park Road, then turn left into Bloomfield Road and the Blackpool A.F.C. Football Ground will be on your right hand side.
