JOHN ASTON, the £30,000 bargain buy from Manchester United, put Luton Town into the lead after 27 minutes this afternoon and threatened to rob Nottingham Forest of their

unbeaten League record. Forest's smallest crowd of

the season showed its displeasure by slow-handclap-ping, jeering, and calling for the resignation of manager Matt Gillies, as Forest struggled to make an impact on the game.

In another undistinguished Forest performance, John Robertson went close to scoring with a shot from 25 yards which was turned on to the post by the Luton goalkeeper, but generally the Reds had few chances
