The disappointment surrounded the fact that a two-goal lead slipped away, but the overall result was a credit to the team and a source of confidence building for this afternoon's cup encounter. Highbury was the scene of an exciting match that was a privilege to watch, with a number of United players putting on top-line performances.



All will be keen to emulate that performance, but none more so than Malcolm Macdonald, who will be out to worry the Luton Town defence in the way that he once worried every other Second Division defence on Luton's behalf.



Undoubtedly, United are in the right frame of mind to make sure they are included in Monday's fifth round draw after such a lengthy absence.

OUR VISITORS: LUTON TOWN

Luton Town were formed in 1885 and turned professional five years later. Their League record has not been outstanding, highest position being eighth in the First Division in 1958, but they have reached the F.A. Cup Final, losing to Nottingham Forest in 1959.



Luton are a team with flair, from the boardroom which includes comedian Eric Morecambe, to outspoken manager Harry Haslam, to the playing staff which is keen, and one of the better sides in the Second Division.



The present staff is a mixture of youth and experience. In goal, Harry Haslam can choose between former Dunstable Town keeper KEITH BARBER and the ex-Manchester United Eire Youth international WILLIE CARRICK.



BOBBY THOMSON is the club captain, once rated the best left-back in England. It was while with Wolves that Bobby collected his England caps. A colleague in defence is big JOHN FAULKNER, signed from Leeds United as a replacement for Chris Nicholl who was sold for a huge fee to Aston Villa. Competing for the No. 5 shirt is the consistent ALAN GARDNER. Alan joined Luton from Millwall and made 10 appearances last season.



Full-back JOHN RYAN is now in the big money class. He is fast, and very constructive when moving forward. Formerly with Arsenal and Fulham, John has made approximately 150 first team appearances. Long-serving JOHN MOORE completes the defensive picture. John was previously with Motherwell.



BOBBY THOMSON

In mid-field Luton choose from former defender ALAN SLOUGH, who joined the side straight from school, former Manchester United inside - forward JIMMY RYAN who was signed for a £20,000 fee, and another ex-Manchester United player, JOHN ASTON, who has considerable First Division and European experience.



VIC HALOM was signed at a fee of £30,000 as a replacement for Malcolm Macdonald. Vic followed the same route as Malcolm—from Fulham. He is proving to be a consistent marksman, linking with record-fee signing RODNEY FERN. Rod played in Leicester's 1969 Cup Final team and is a strong, bustling type with a highly developed goal sense.



Top goalscorer last season was former Hendon amateur PETER ANDERSON, and Luton can also consider former Newcastle winger GORDON HINDSON, and the man who scored two goals for the Magpies last season, viv BUSBY.

1955–56	FULHAM 4, NEWCASTLE UNITED 5 (Dare we mention it—Sunderland knocked United out in the Sixth Round.)
1956–57	MILLWALL 2, NEWCASTLE UNITED 1
1957–58	NEWCASTLE UNITED 1, SCUNTHORPE UNITED 3
1960–61	NEWCASTLE UNITED 4, STOCKPORT COUNTY 0 (United reached the 6th Round but were then rocked by Second Division Sheffield United.)
1962-63	NORWICH CITY 5, NEWCASTLE UNITED 0
1965–66	NEWCASTLE UNITED 1, SHEFFIELD WEDNESDAY 2
1966–67	NOTTINGHAM FOREST 3, NEWCASTLE UNITED 0
1968–69	MANCHESTER CIT' 2, NEWCASTLE UNITED 0 (This was in a replay after a goalless first meeting.)

Today's home match with Luton Town represents the 16th time that United have reached the Fourth Round since the war.


