The Editor's View - - -

The F.A. Cup is with us once again today and we welcome visitors Luton Town from the Second Division for this fifthround tie.

Today's game will be the Wanderers' NINTH F.A. Cup-tie this season. They entered the competition at the first round stage and are the only club still in the tourney to have done so.

The long trail started for them back on November 18 when Fourth Division Chester visited Burnden Park. The result was a 1-1 draw with John Byrom scoring the Wanderers' goal.

Garry Jones was the scorer of the only goal in the replay at Sealand Road and the Wanderers went through to meet Third Division Shrewsbury in the second round.

Ron Phillips, Stuart Lee and John Ritson were on target in that game as the Wanderers strode to a 3-0 win.

Their reward was an away tie in the third round against fellow Second Division side Charlton Athletic.

And after the Wanderers had gone behind to a first-half penalty which was taken twice, Stuart Lee popped up with a late header to earn a replay.

The Wanderers strode into the fourth round with a 4-0 win on snow-covered Burnden thanks to goals from Peter Nicholson, Roy Greaves (2) and Garry Jones.

Then came a marathon tie against Second Division Cardiff, which started with a 2-2 draw at Burnden — the equalising goal coming in the fifth minute of time added on for stoppages.

Again Garry Jones came to the Wanderers' rescue with a fine equaliser at Cardiff, and in the second replay at West Bromwich, Stuart Lee put the Wanderers into the fifth round and today's game against Luton.

Luton's last visit to Burnden was in the Second Division and they figured in the first game of the 1970-71 season here.

Then, the result was a 4-2 win for the Wanderers — who will be hoping that history will repeat itself today.

If today's tie is a draw, the replay will be on Wednesday at Luton, kick-off 7-30 p.m.

Today's Visitors

LUTON TOWN

WILLIE CARRICK (Goalkeeper). — Newcomer who was freed by Manchester United at the end of last season. Born in Dublin, is a former Eire Youth International and, at nineteen, is regarded as a highly useful prospect.

JOHN RYAN (Right-back). — Although he had played games in their League team, Fulham released this capable defender two seasons ago and, since joining Luton, has improved out of recognition and is now in the big money class. Kent born, he had a spell with Arsenal before going to Craven Cottage.

BOBBY THOMSON (Left-back). — Not so many years ago, Thomson was regarded as the best left-back in the country and has a handful of England caps to prove it. Was then with Wolves from whom he moved to Birmingham City for a big fee. Somehow or another, he never really settled with Birmingham, who loaned him to Walsall during last season and then gave him a free transfer.

ALAN GARNER (Centre-half). — His big chance came when Chris Nicholl was sold to Aston Villa last March and he went on to play confidently and earn himself a regular place. Was previously with Millwall who gave him few opportunities. Strong and assertive.

ALAN SLOUGH (Half-back). — During the last two seasons, he has been regarded primarily as a member of the back four, but it has now been decided to use his undoubted talent and driving power in midfield. A local, he joined Luton straight from school.

JOHN MOORE (Half-back). — Luton's longest serving player, he has been with them nearly eight years, having had previous service with Motherwell. A dour Scot, he has been a regular member of the back four and struck up an uncanny understanding with Nicholl.

JOHN ASTON (Forward). — Several other clubs were disappointed when Aston moved to Luton for a fee of £30,000, which begins to look a bargain figure. Now only 25, Aston has a load of First Division experience gained with Manchester United with whom he was a member of the First Team squad for some seasons.

JIMMY RYAN (Forward). — Another who took the now well-beaten track from Old Trafford to Kenilworth Road and he was valued at around £20,000 at the time. A Scot, he had a most unlucky last season through injuries and illness, but has been showing his best form this time.

VIV BUSBY (Forward). — Recruited from Wycombe Wanderers and spent two months on loan to Newcastle United during last season. In the end, Newcastle decided not to meet the £50,000 fee Luton were asking and he was allowed to return.

GORDON HINDSON (Forward). — Although this youngster had only limited experience at the time, Luton paid Newcastle United £25,000 for him, and are expecting big things from him this season. Was used mostly as a winger and has a considerable turn of speed.

BARRY BUTLIN (Centre-forward). — Signed from Derby County on 29th November, 1972, and made his first-team debut for Luton against Queens Park Rangers on 9th December. Scored in each of his first three games.

Talking Soccer

In football, as in most other professions, this is the age of the specialist. With greater concentration than ever before on tactical planning, every position on the field demands greater expertise than it did in the happy-go-lucky past.

There was a time when it was said that a good footballer should be able to play anywhere. Some of the all-time greats did so.

They might have been able to do so in this age of specialisation, but some of them might not have found it so easy as in the past.

Because of the positional demands that managers and coaches now make on players, the case of Paul Madeley, of Leeds and England, is quite remarkable.

When, in his new club role of centre-half he shows sufficient grace and skill to be compared with West German captain Franz Beckenbauer it seems quite astonishing to note that he arrived in this berth after playing in nine others.

Madeley, who has taken on every job apart from that of goal-keeper, slots into positions with such natural ease that wherever he plays he gives the impression that he might have been a specialist in that role throughout his career.

He is so effective as a midfield man that I am quite sure Sir Alf Ramsey made a mistake when he did not pit him against West German key man Gunther Netzer in the European Nations championship game at Wembley which turned out to be such a big disappointment for England.

When one also considers that Madeley must be among the best half-dozen right backs in the world, it isn't surprising that many managers in this country regard him as the Leeds club's most priceless player asset.

Temperament as well as technique plays a tremendous part in the success of the game's most adaptable footballers.

That is why Liverpool's Emlyn Hughes has made light of his many switches for his club and for England.

In every one of the back four berths or in midfield Hughes has always been so successful that I am quite convinced he could widen his range even further and be just as effective up front as a striker.

You don't have to accept my opinion on that point, for no less an expert than Liverpool manager Bill Shankly holds that view.

And, by the way, Hughes would certainly be his man to take over in goal if ever an emergency situation should arise through injury to Ray Clemence.

Among the most adaptable players of recent times at club though not at international level have been Geoff Strong (formerly of Liverpool), Sandy Brown (ex-Everton) and Arthur Bellamy (Burnley).

Strong played in First Division football in every position apart from that of goal-keeper. Brown, at some stage in his career with four clubs, played in all 11 positions.

Some of the most versatile stars of the past were Johnny Carey (Manchester United and the Republic of Ireland), Billy Elliott (Bradford, Burnley and Sunderland), Con Martin (Leeds and Aston Villa) and Billy Cush (Leeds).

Jack Rowley and Bobby Charlton each played in four front-line positions for England, and Tom Finney appeared in three.

But men like Carey, Martin and Cush could switch from defence to attack or the other way round to turn in outstanding performances.

Carey was picked for his country in every department — as a full-back, half-back and forward.

Cush, though only five feet three, even shone when switched to centre-half for Northern Ireland.

And Con Martin, father of Manchester United's newcomer, Mick, was selected as an international goalkeeper, even though his most frequent of several berths for his country was centre-half.

LEAGUELINER A WINNER


The Wanderers used the new Leagueliner train for the game at Bournemouth last Saturday — and the trip was an outstanding success.

His early refereeing was done in the Stroud and District League and Western League.

Apart from last season's Cup Final, he handled the 1964 Amateur Cup Final, the 1965-66 League Cup Final, the 1971 Challenge Trophy Final and the 1971 Watney Cup Final.

He also took control of the Hungary v. Rumania Nations Cup quarter-final last season.

A chargehand linesman for the Midlands Electricity Board he is married with a son, is secretary of the Stroud and District League and serves on various committees connected with this league. Away from football, he enjoys a game of darts.
