MALCOLM ALLISON continues to puff his

champers, Crystal Palace
continue to lose, and, perhaps more amazingly, the Selhurst Park fans maso-chistically continue to turn up in droves.

Nearly 20,000 saw their favourites continue their slide towards total obscurity on Sat-urday, when a no more than ordinary Luton side became the latest to show just how bad Palace are.

Manager Allison, for once wearing a worried frown behind the cigar smoke and bubbly, afterwards proclaimed that he thought Palace were at last beginning to show more togetherness. And, certainly, they offered a bit more of their old grim determination against Luton.

Luton flatter

Luton rather flattered to deceive. They have scored more goals than anyone else in the Second Division and, at first, they looked really dangerous, with crisp passing up front, giving Aston acres of room on the left flank.

But it was not until the 51st minute that Anderson dived forward to head them into the lead from Aston's free-kick. Rogers scooped home Tambling's cross for the equaliser after 58 minutes, but Butlin soared to head Luton's winner from Hindson's cross just three minutes later.
