

BARBER'S SAVE CLEARS LUTON

A last minute penalty save by goal keeper Barber, carried Luton through to a 3—2 away victory over Bury in their League Cup third round replay.

Luton will be away to Millwall in the next round. Bury went ahead after Anderson tried to make amends for a faulty clearance by pulling down Spence as he shot. Rudd scored from the penalty spot.

Luton's collective skill, however, proved an effective counter, and Butlin had had several chances to equalise before Anderson sank to his knees to head home a Shanks free-kick.

Barber cautioned

It was not long before Bury regained their lead. Barber came out of his area to block Murray, and received a caution. Rudd put the free-kick to Hamstead, who scored with a rising drive.

Hamstead however, was at fault when Luton scored their second equaliser a minute after half-time. His attempted clearance found Shanks, whose deceptively slow shot slipped past Forrest.

Luton went into the lead when West side-footed in a third goal from an Anderson cross. Barber then saved Rudd's penalty shot in the dying minutes of the game.
