From the first, Neil Rioch, who showed plenty of ciever touches, muffed a header. Then Brian Little just failed to control a fine pass and later Rioch shot over after another Altken onslaught.

Though Alan West was an inspiring and cultured midfield grafter for them, Luton's clearcut openings were rare.

Credit for this goes to exkenilworth Road pivot Chris Nicholl, unbeatable in the air and dominant on the ground. Nicholl also forced a brilliant save from Graham Horne with a header from a corner.

There was enough enterprise and entertainment from both sides to encourage the watching Sir Alf Ramsey and League secretary Alan Hardaker.

Peter Anderson maintained Luton's promotion surge with the 53rd minute winner which brought Town's haul to. 12 points from the last eight games and pushed them into second place.

He moved up smartly to head in a John Aston corner. It was his eighth goal of the season and edges him to the top of Luton's scoring chart.

Barry Butlin went close to scoring just before and after Anderson's winner and there were other promising attempts from West and Jimmy Ryan.

In a late Villa flurry, Little, always eager and menacing, was only fractionally wide with a gallant equalising attempt.

Villa manager Vic Crowe drew some comfort by pointing out: "This was our best performance for weeks and should give the boys confidence."

And he added that he was hopeful that key men Sam Morgan, Ray Graydon and Bruce Ricch, who have been badly missed recently, would be fit for Saturday's match against Notts County.
