STAN BOWLES, the man soccer
fans love to hate, sparked off the

controversy that had Luton boss Harry Haslam, fuming at referee

Les Hayes.

Bowles, involved in a twice-taken penalty after an extra ball was thrown into the goalmouth by a fan, made V-signs at the angry Luton crowd before he was booked minutes later.

Haslam snapped afterwards:
"What is the good of the League sending round a new directive about players' behaviour to stop incensing crowds?

"Last Wednesday, I gave our own Gordon Hindson a ticking-off for making a V-sign at the crowd.

"Then along comes Bowles, great player though he is, and he's getting at the crowd all the time

He added: "The fans don't know how bad my ankles have got through all the stick I have to take. People should think about things like that before they start
