In the early stages, United play cool and classy football, and up to half-time there seemed every chance of a Cumbrian victory.

But a shrewd tactical change by the home side gave them a pronounced edge during the second period, when the Carlisle defence was often badly exposed.

Laidlaw nearly put United ahead on the stroke of half-time when he chased a long clearance from defence. Luton wrongly anticipated offside, and goalkeeyer Barber had to race right out of his area to

clear the danger.

Luton began to apply heavy pressure from the restart, after Carr had sliced and clearance straight to Alston on the edge of the box, the gangling forward wriggled past a host of defenders before pushing the ball home.

The Carlisle defence crumbled again when Parker handed another flerce Husband shot. Jim Ryan beat Ross easily from the

nenalty spot.
