

CLOBBERED

LUTON are off the bottom for the first time since October, but manager Harry Haslam is in no mood to study League tables this weekend.

After his side had chucked away a point beyond price against Chelsea — themselves with their backs to the wall — the normally - placid Haslam crucified his own goalkeeper, Graham Horn.

It was Horn's refusal to leave his line to snare a Charlie Cooke corner eight minutes from time that led to a collision between Haslam and the former Arsenal goalkeeper.

As Horn stood rooted, Ian Hutchinson's head and finally Steve Kember's boot forced in the ball and Haslam said scathingly: "I've told him the goal was his fault.

"He is big and strong enough to come for those crosses. But he didn't and we dropped a point. That's two weeks running he has let us down—last week he was to blame for the goal that put us out of the Cup.

my top. Usually I count up to 10. When I saw him after the game he just nodded—he was too busy telling others what they should have done."

But the unfortunate Horn is likely to keep his place at Burnley next week because reserve goalkeeper Keith Barber is injured.

Yet had Luton accepted just one more of the stream of goals there for the taking, Horn's blunder would have been academic. Luton were the better side and worth what would have been their fourth successive League win.

Jimmy Husband scored Luton's goal in the 63rd

minute after Cooke had given the ball away in his own half and there should have been more.

Chelsea were disorganised when John Dempsey went off in the first half and Ron Stuart, the Chelsea manager, acknowledges his good fortune in snatching a point.

But he can't be happy with some of his young fans who flocked on the pitch just before Kember's goal and only instant mopping up by police and stewards averted what could have been an ugly situation.
