

Anderson the hero

SELDOM has a goal brought so much pleasure to its scorer and seldom has a team deserved a goal more than Luton did yesterday.

They had the unluckiest of breaks midway through the first half and went a goal behind—but they never gave up hope and fought back magnificently to earn a point with nine minutes to go.

Their midfield player, Anderson, added the finishing touch from close in to a run and shot from Husband for the equaliser and his reaction was one of sheer delight.

It reflected right through a Luton side which is obviously fighting hard to lift itself from the most unwanted position in the First Division.

Luton's pressure after Woodward had put Sheffield ahead in the 30th minute might have paid off earlier had Brown not pulled off a series of fine saves and Colquhoun been in top form.

But in their captain, West and winger Aston Luton had attackers of imagination and they looked well worth a goal a long time before Anderson scored.

United's goal came when a short pass from Futchler, called up 24 hours earlier by Don Revie for England's get together next week, "jumped" on a piece of mud just as Faulkner was about to play the ball.

The former Leeds centre half missed the ball and Woodward happily ran through from the right to shoot low into the net for his eighth goal of the season.
