

Leicester give it away—

Weller, Whitworth and Blockley were all in a tangle trying to beat off a Luton attack, and Weller's back-pass skidded off Wallington into the net.

Blockley had been left stranded 14 minutes earlier when Australian World Cup player

Alston headed Luton's first goal from a left-wing cross by West.

Frank Worthington had a thin time against Faulkner, while Leicester's defence looked ill-at-ease against Luton's small, but speedy forwards.

Wallington did well to make saves from Anderson and Jim Ryan, and Leicester's only real scoring efforts of the match was a header from Lee which was inches wide.

Thirteen minutes from time Leicester paid the penalty for continual use of the offside trap when Alston broke through it. Wallington parried his shot, but Husband followed up to score from close-range.
