Fortunately for the Wanderers 13 players had been taken on the trip and teenage attacker Steve Taylor was named as sub. It was the first change made by the Wanderers in five games.

## ROBBED

Luton had an escape in the opening moments of the game when Nicholson and Thompson linked on the Bol-Nichoison left. crossed to Byrom, whose curling right foot shot at goal brought a tremendous save from Barber, who flung himself to turn the ball past the post.

Greaves took corner but the kick was not a good one and Aston picked up the ball near his own penalty area and tried to run it to safety. But he was robbed and as Bolton came straight back Greaves was caught offside.

A Greaves slip sent Aston away and this time Ron Futcher fell into the Bolton offside
