

THE ^{75/76} FIVE-STAR FAREWELL

CHARLTON ATH 1,
LUTON TOWN 5

PETER ANDERSON marked his last league appearance for the Town with two superb goals as the Town roared to their best away win for years at Charlton.

The Londoners, after looking worth at least one point in the first half, were swamped as the Town let rip with an incred-

ible scoring burst of three goals in three minutes after the break.

It was a real five-star performance, with the whole team clicking into top gear, and goals being scored from the sort of chances that have gone begging in previous matches.

Charlton had the better of the early exchanges, and deserved their lead given to them after seven minutes when Flanagan made a fast diagonal run to score with a near-post header from a free kick by Peacock.

Derek Hales nearly added a

second, but although his shot beat Barber, John Ryan cleared from under the bar. It looked a close thing, and the Town were none too steady until they snatched an equaliser after 38 minutes.

Chambers made it with a brilliant pass through Charlton's square line of defenders. Anderson completed it equally brilliantly, running through and shooting hard as the goalkeeper came out.

Play was fast and entertaining, and after 57 minutes Alan West, who was in tremendous form,

smacked a long cross into the goal-mouth. Andy King's shot hit the bar, and Jim Husband threw himself full-length to head the Town into the lead.

Within two minutes, West and John Aston combined to set up another chance for Husband, and he headed into the top corner from near the penalty spot.

Within 60 seconds, Brian Chambers had gone through to collect a pass by Buckley to hit goal number four, and after 73 minutes Anderson collected the fifth after a break and accurate pass by West.
