They took the lead through Husband after 24 minutes and although Wood raced 40 yards to equalise with a spectacular header, King restored the lead from a precise centre by Aston.

Luton, yards faster and more precise in their passing, would have won by a wider margin but for the smart anticipation in goal of Wealands. He made several fine reflex saves.

Lyall, Hull's new signing from Nottingham Forest, created a favourable impression and with only a few minutes left almost equalised with a splendid shot from a free-kick by Fletcher.

Barber, however in the Luton goal, made a great save at full length.
