But they've got no problems with another West—skipper Alan West, the man who has sparked off the revival that has now given them eight wins in a row.

Luton were ready to sit back when they had

three goals in the bag—and that might have been disastrous if 'keeper Barber hadn't been in such spark-ling form.

For Barber—who must take much of the blame for letting Piper score Pompey's only goal when a goal-kick went wrong—more than made amends by pulling out two brilliant saves to stop the same player getting a hat-trick.
