

Husband Haunts ^{75/76} Sunderland

THE North East has always been proud of Jimmy Husband, the schoolboy international who chose to seek fame outside the area, starting with Everton.

There was a sharp reminder for Sunderland at Kenilworth Road when Husband turned up as the schemer of their downfall in Luton side which had little to offer without him.

He didn't get his name on the score sheet, but it was written all over the action in both goals—and one or two near misses.

After a great break, Husband reached the point where only Moncur barred his path to goal. Moncur tried to block the shot, but deflected it out of Montgomery's reach.

Five minutes from the end Husband strode away again to draw Montgomery and chip towards the empty goal. Futchcr could have just stood back and applauded the goal, but chose to make sure by touching home.

Sunderland had produced little of the pattern which has pleased their supporters in recent weeks. Late on, they brought on Greenwood for Finney, but it was not a one-man job to get them organised, particularly at the front.

The rearguard had looked sound enough, and Luton not too imaginative, until that first goal went in.
