Leave the M4 at intersection No. 19 and continue on the M32 until the exit with the B4058 Park Road junction with Muller Road and Fishponds Road. Continue along

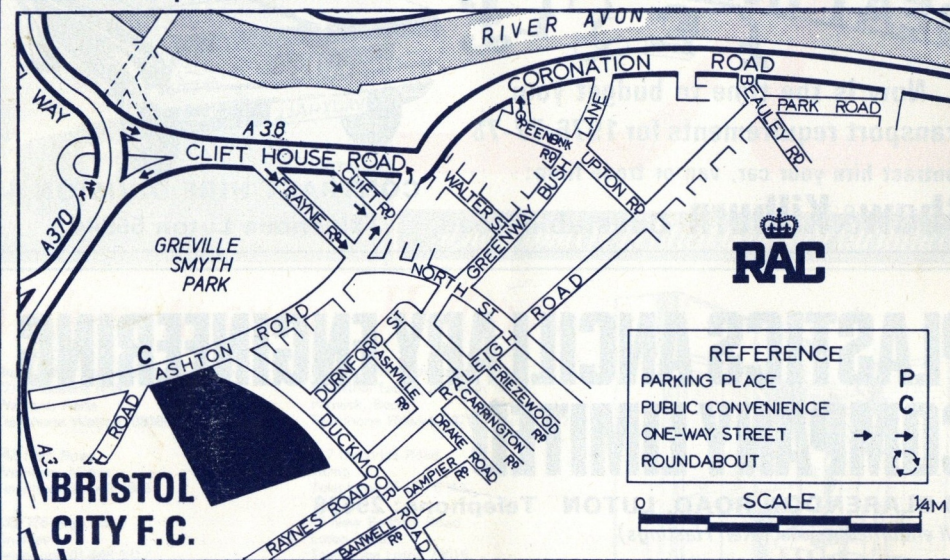
Fishponds Road and then the A432 Stapleton Road.

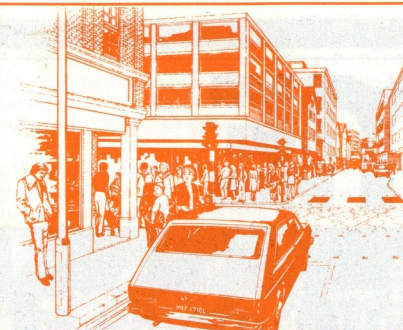

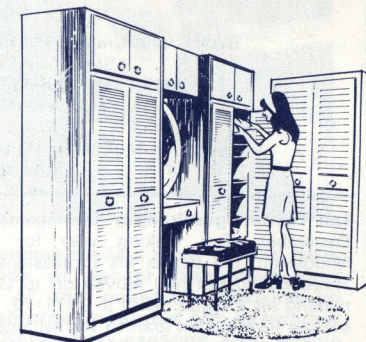

Ian Turner, goalkeeper. Ian regained his place in December after making way for young Steve Middleton. Ian began his professional career with Huddersfield but had moved on to Grimsby before making his League debut in 1971-72. The following season he went on loan to Walsall and two seasons ago Southampton paid £10,000 for him. Appearances: Huddersfield 0, Grimsby 26, Walsall (loan) 3, Southampton 45.

Peter Rodrigues, defender. Peter is enjoying a new lease of life after surprisingly being given a free transfer by Sheffield Wednesday at the end of last season. Capped on 40 occasions by Wales, Peter also won Under-23 honours. His first club was Cardiff City, for whom he made his League debut in 1963-64. He was transferred to Leicester for £40,000 in 1966 and three years later was a member of their F.A. Cup final team. Wednesday paid £50,000 for him in 1970. Appearances: Cardiff City 85, 2 goals, Leicester City 138, 6 goals, Sheffield Wednesday 162, 2 goals, Southampton 27, 1 goal.

Mel Blyth, defender. Southampton paid Crystal Palace £60,000 for Mel at the beginning of last season and his presence at the centre of their defence did much to give it a more solid basis. He had been with Palace since 1968, when they paid £10,000 for him after he had spent one season in Scunthorpe's senior side. Appearances: Scunthorpe 27, 3 goals, Crystal Palace 213 (3), 9 goals, Southampton 58 (1), 3 goals.

Jim Steele, defender. Jim has been turning out at left-back this season though most of his previous appearances were at the centre of the defence. But he has earned himself a reputation as a versatile character—in 1970-71 he played in five different positions for Dundee. Southampton paid £65,000 for him the following season. Appearances: Dundee 73 (3), 4 goals, Southampton 136 (2) 2 goals.

David Peach, defender. David has played as often at left-back as he had done in midfield for Southampton. He served his apprenticeship with Gilling-

ham and the Saints paid £50,000 to sign him in 1974. Appearances: Gillingham 186 (1), 30 goals, Southampton 73 (3), 10 goals.

Nick Holmes, midfielder. Nick won his chance in the Saints' senior side in 1973-74, established himself as a regular last season and is now playing with more confidence than ever, getting in on the scoring act quite regularly. He was second highest scorer with 10 goals before the weekend. Appearances: 48 (5), 12 goals.

Jim McCalliog, midfielder. The Saints signed Jim from Manchester United for £45,000 last season. One of the game's most experienced midfield men, Jim won five Scottish caps in his Sheffield Wednesday days after being discarded by Chelsea. Even earlier, he was a Leeds amateur but they didn't follow up their interest. After leaving Sheffield Wednesday in 1969, he joined Wolves in a £70,000 deal. Manchester United paid £60,000 for him in 1974. Appearances: Leeds United 0, Chelsea 7, 2 goals, Sheffield Wednesday 150, 19 goals, Wolves 158 (5), 34 goals, Manchester United 31, 7 goals, Southampton 38 (1), 4 goals.

Hugh Fisher, midfielder. Hugh first impressed the Saints when he had a fine game for Blackpool against them. They promptly paid £35,000 for him in 1967 and he has been a vital member of their midfield unit for much of the time since. He lost almost one season, through, though a broken leg. Appearances: Blackpool 51 (3), 1 goal, Southampton 274 (5), 7 goals.

Mike Channon, striker. Mike won his 30th England cap in this season's European Championship tie in Portugal yet has for some time shown concern that playing in the Second Division might affect his future England chances. Southampton, obviously, don't want to lose him but now the Saints are bidding so strongly for promotion it seems they might be able to keep their prize asset. Mike has been Southampton's leading scorer for the past five seasons and is once again in front with 14 to his credit before Saturday's cup-tie. Appearances: 334 (4), 131 goals.

Peter Osgood, striker. Southampton smashed all club records in 1974 when they paid Chelsea £275,000 for this former England striker. He won four full caps, in addition to youth and Under-23 honours. Peter made his senior bow for Chelsea when he was 16 and was on three occasions their

top scorer. Appearances: Chelsea 265 (3), 104 goals, Southampton 69 (3), 20 goals.

Bobby Stokes, striker. A former England Youth international, Bobby can play equally well in midfield or as a striker. He has been a regular member of the club's senior squad for five years, after making his initial appearance in 1968-68. Appearances: 170 (21), 37 goals.

Paul Gilchrist, striker. Though Paul has not been holding a regular place this season, he is usually named as substitute. He began his career with Charlton, a club he joined as a schoolboy but in 1971 he moved north to Doncaster. Southampton signed him a year later. Appearances: Charlton 5 (2), Fulham (loan) 0, Doncaster 22, 8 goals, Southampton 80 (11), 17 goals.

SPOTLIGHT LAWRIE McMENEMY



Lawrie McMenemy made a rapid switch from the backwoods of soccer management to become one of the country's best-known faces. Southampton appointed him as number two to Ted Bates two seasons ago, within weeks he was in full charge and by the end of the campaign he was a member of TV's World Cup panel.

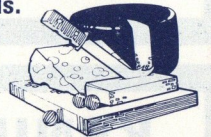

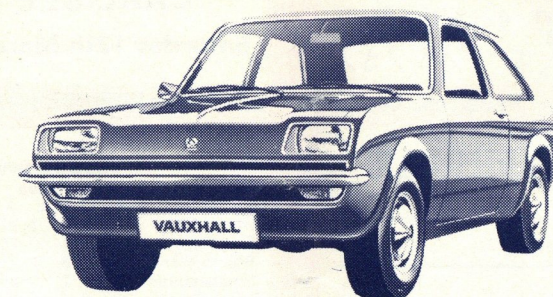
