

# FOCUS On...

# **ANDY NELSON**

Andy Nelson last season had the distinction of managing a promotion-winning team for the second season in succession. The previous year he led Gillingham back into Division Three and then left to take on a challenge at Charlton Athletic, promoted to Division Two at the end of last season.

Mr Nelson is one of a small army of former West Ham United players who have become managers. He became a part-time professional with the Hammers in December, 1953, continuing his apprenticeship in marine engineering. He made a couple of first-team appearances in 1954-55 but later had to undergo his National Service.

After two years he returned to West Ham as a full-timer but he left in 1959 to start the most successful phase of his career with Ipswich Town. He was a member of their Second and First Division Championship teams in the early 'Sixties, keeping up an ever-present record when they won the top title.

He enjoyed five very successful years at Portman Road, then moved on to Orient for about a year. Early in the 1965-66 season he was transferred to Plymouth Argyle where he completed his playing days in 1969. Earlier, he had developed his interest in coaching and after leaving Argyle he was taken on to Millwall's coaching staff.

He took over at Gillingham during the 1971 close season.

COLIN POWELL. Aged 27, married with two children, signed for Charlton in January, 1973, from Southern League club, Barnet, for a fee of £10,000.

# **COLIN POWELL**

Colin is finding the Second Division very much to his liking after having his most successful season with Charlton making 43 League appearances and scoring seven goals in last season's promotion side. He is generally thought of as being an old-fashioned type of winger constantly taking on the full-back and crossing.

### **CHARLTON ATHLETIC PEN PICTURES**

**JEFF WOOD, Goalkeeper.** Jeff was discovered in amateur football and has been a professional for only four months. He got a surprise chance in Charlton's first-team when Graham Tutt was badly injured and enjoyed a splendid debut against Nottingham Forest last month. League record: Charlton 4 aps.

**GRAHAM TUTT, Goalkeeper.** Graham was well established as first-choice goalkeeper until he received serious facial injuries in the game at Sunderland in February. He made his League debut two seasons ago and last season had a loan spell with Workington. League record: Workington 4 aps, Charlton 65 aps.

**LESLIE BERRY, Defender.** Leslie has won his chance in the senior side this season and has been holding down the right-back spot in recent weeks. He scored his first goal in their 2-2 draw with Bristol City. League record: Charlton 4(1) aps, 1 gl.

JIMMY GILES, Defender. Charlton signed Jim from Exeter City last summer and he has taken over the centre-back position. He began his career with Swindon Town in 1965-66, moved to Aldershot in 1968 and to Exeter three years later. League record: Swindon 12(11) aps, Aldershot 80(1) aps, 3 gls, Exeter 183 aps, 6 gls, Charlton 32 aps, 2 gls.

**BOB CURTIS, Defender.** Bob, came into the side in 1966-67, celebrated his 300th first-team game last month. When Charlton are awarded a penalty, Bob is usually entrusted with the kick. He converted five last season and has been successful once this term. League record: Charlton 274(12), aps, 28 gls.

**DAVID YOUNG, Defender.** David began his career with Newcastle United and he was for some while a regular member of their First Division side. He moved to Sunderland in January, 1973, and then joined Charlton for £20,000 in the close-season of 1974. League record: Newcastle 41(2) aps, 2 gls, Sunderland 24(6) aps, 1 gl, Charlton 67 aps.

MARK PENFOLD, Defender. Mark has only recently dropped out of the team after holding the right-back position for most of the season. One of several young members of the squad, Mark had the boost of a loan spell with Manchester United last season. League record: Charlton 44(2) aps...

PHIL WARMAN, Defender. Phil joined Charlton from school and gained England Youth honours in his early days. Charlton gave him his chance in their League side in 1969-70 and, until recently dropping out, he had been a regular for over four years. League record: Charlton 173(3) aps, 12 gls.

TONY YOUNG, Midfield. Tony recently joined Charlton from Manchester United where he had been since leaving school. He won his way into United's team in 1970-71 and later enjoyed several long runs in the side. But, when he failed to get in this season, he decided to make a fresh start at The Valley. League record: United 69(13) aps, 1 gl, Charlton 6 aps, 1 gl.

**KEITH PEACOCK, Midfield.** Keith is now Charlton's longest-serving player and he recently completed 400 League appearances for the club. In his first season, back in 1962-63, he was joint top scorer. League record: Charlton 399(16) aps, 79 gls.

**RICHIE BOWMAN, Midfield.** Richie made his debut in 1972-73, winning a regular place last season. When Bob Curtis is not in the side,

Richie is usually entrusted with penalty kicks. Two of his three goals this season came from the spot. League record: Charlton 81(1) aps, 6 gls.

**PETER HUNT, Midfield.** Peter is a former England Youth international. He came into League football with Southend in 1968-69 and transferred to Charlton in 1972 after initially joining them on loan. League record: Southend 31(8) aps, 1 gl, Charlton 97(16) aps, 6 gls.

COLIN POWELL, Striker. Colin walked straight into Charlton's senior team three seasons ago after joining them from Southern League club Barnet. League record: Charlton 125(6) aps, 16 gls.

**DEREK HALES, Striker.** Derek needs no introduction to Hatter's fans for it was here at Kenilworth Road that he rose from the amateur ranks to make his League debut in 1972-73. He has been a tremendous success at The Valley, topping their scoring list with 21 goals last season. Now, with 21 League goals and three more in the Cup, he has a great chance of being the first player to score 30 League goals and claim the *Daily Express* £10,000 prize. League record: Luton 5(2) aps, 1 gl, Charlton 100(3) aps, 50 gls.

**GEORGE HOPE, Striker.** George was injured shortly after joining Charlton from Newcastle United this season and he is only now getting the chance to establish himself. He made his League bow for Newcastle in 1973-74 but was generally a reserve player at St. James Park. League record: Newcastle 6 aps, 1 gl, Charlton 11 aps, 2 gls.


MIKE FLANAGAN, Striker. Mike won three England Youth caps in his Tottenham days but he didn't get into the Spurs League side. They gave him a free transfer in 1971 when he signed for Charlton. 

# TOWN (HAT

Sixteen points out of twenty is a deserved reward for the hard work and skilful play shown by a young reserve side in the recent Football Combination games. Several new faces have forced their way into the side and have shown skill and composure belying their years. If they can continue to learn and listen, there is every reason to believe that given vital time they can eventually progress to first team football.

The players that have made the transition from youth to Combination football are Tim Smith, a forceful 16-year-old from Gloucester, Tony Knight, a giant 16-year-old goalkeeper who now has over 20 reserve games under his belt, Ricky Hill, a talented coloured lad from London who has shown some brilliant 'black magic' and Graham Jones, the youngest of the four who is a powerful back-four player who shows scant respect for opposition reputations.

Supporting these youngsters, Peter Mead has shown good progress at full-back and David Carr is also proving his defensive qualities. At the heart of the defence Paul Price has shown tremendous resolution to fight back from a twice broken leg to be an inspiring captain. 


