Dixie is the Dean of a super Luton show

THERE was no fluke about this victory for Luton at rainswept Turf Moor.

It was right against the run of play when Paul Bradshaw put Burnley ahead after 37 minutes.

And it was simple justice when after half a dozen good shots by Luton to every one by Burnley, that Dixie Deans headed an equaliser just three minutes later.

Former Manchester United winger John Aston set up the centre from which 17-year-old Ricky Hill scored the winner for Luton 11 minutes from the end.

It was well deserved, and on this showing Burnley will only be an ordinary Second Division outfit this season.

Luton worked tirelessly, and the only blotches on their performances were bookings for Aston and Paul Futchner.

Then Jimmy Husband had a shot kicked off the Burnley line by 19-year-old left-back Terry Pashley.

Aston won almost everything against full-back Derek Scott, and it was no surprise when Aston provided the centre from which Hill headed Luton's winner.
