DEANS LIFTS LUTON

DIXIE DEANS, Luton's £20,000 bargain buy from Celtic repaid another slice of his transfer fee with his fifth goal for his new club. His 66th minute shot into the roof of the Wolves net from a Faulkner header put an end to a threatened Wolves revival, started off by a Ken Hibbett goal only five minutes earlier.

Deans stopped Wolves in their tracks and Luton showed the Molineux men just how tough it can be at the top, making Wolves concede their first home goals of the season.

On a ground where Wolves scored five goals without reply last week they were struggling, and had only two shots on target in the first half—both from Daley.

Jimmy Husband had shaken Wolves in the 28th minute with his first League goal of the season. West took a corner, Ron Futcher back-headed and Husband slammed the ball into the net.

When Wolves got their first corner in the 61st minute it brought an equaliser, Hibbett volleying the ball into the net. But their hopes were short-lived. Deans' goal quickly fol-
