

And if I were given say £25,000 to go out and spend on new talent, then we would not have to expect to get an England World Cup player.

We would have to shop within our budget. And I would also have to look carefully. I have had several things lined up already this season, but they have come to nothing. Sometimes

other clubs say they will do things for you that don't always happen.

I had a couple of deals on the table, but so far the clubs involved have not come up with the goods.

We have not had the best of luck so far with injuries, and our latest casualty, John Faulkner, had a nasty time with his knee last week. He had to have some painful cortisone injections and have the leg put in plaster. We all hope John will be back in full training before long.

Still, it says something for our youth policy when we are able to chuck a youngster like Gary Jones in at the deep end.

And at last we had a bit of luck with a penalty. We were awarded our first of the season after half a dozen going against us, and Steve Buckley cracked it home.

I am just disappointed that the result was not right. We will be aiming to put that right today against Cardiff, and we welcome their manager Jimmy Andrews, a former Luton coach, back to Kenilworth Road.

Jimmy has done a good job in difficult circumstances at Ninian Park, and I am glad to say that he has done it with a bit of help from our former Australian World Cup striker Adrian Alston.

Let's hope we have a good game and, no bad feeling for Jimmy at all, that the result goes the right way for us. We don't half need a couple of points today.

TOWN

Cardiff City

RON HEALEY (goalkeeper): City's first choice goalkeeper for most of last season — but always under tremendous pressure from the strong and talented Bill Irwin. Made his Cardiff debut in March, 1974 and several weeks later ended a loan period from Manchester City by signing for a five figure fee. A coalminer's son, he made his First Division debut for Manchester City at 17, thus becoming one of the youngest in League history.

BILL IRWIN (goalkeeper): Signed from Irish League Club Bangor for £8,000 in October, 1971. The regular choice until Healey's arrival, he produced an inspired spell last season to regain his place for several weeks. A former Irish amateur International who made his debut within 48 hours of becoming a professional.

PHIL DWYER (defender): Local product who skippered the Welsh under-23 side last season and gained a place in the senior squad. A consistent defender who has also played mid-field and central striker. Until this season, however, his first choice position was right-back: now he is expected to emerge as an outstanding centre-half succeeding Mike England in the number five shirt.

former Scottish Youth player who played in the same national side as Tommy Craig and Kenny Dalglish. Came to Wales after being given a free transfer by Celtic in August, 1969 and enjoyed his best season for Cardiff in 1975/76. Can play on either side and also in mid-field.

CLIVE CHARLES (defender): Won the Player's Award last season for being the best left-back in the Third Division. Signed at end of 1973/74 season after several weeks on loan from West Ham and still developing as a stylish, gifted defender of sharp control and pace.

BRIAN ATTLEY (defender): Has made a number of first team appearances over the last two seasons and improved with almost every game. A young, locally produced full-back who has now recovered from a bad injury run in the second half of last season.

KEITH PONTIN (defender): Yet another young player from the Cardiff area who is making great strides. A tall, talented and commanding centre-half who is expected to challenge strongly for a regular first team place this season after several promising appearances in Welsh Cup matches.

RICHIE MORGAN (defender): One of Cardiff's most loyal and longest serving players. A former Welsh under-23 centre-half, he understudied first Don Murray, who played over 500 games for Cardiff, and then Mike England.

ALBERT LARMOUR (defender): A safe, dependable defensive wing-half whose great merit is his consistency. Has played alongside Murray, Morgan and England and efficiently marked out of the game some of football's best known strikers.

DAVID GILES (midfield): One of the most exciting young players in Welsh football. Born just a few hundred yards away from the ground, he has progressed swiftly at Ninian Park where his sparkling control and pace have won him several Wales Youth caps.

JOHN BUCHANAN (midfield): Among the best strikers of a ball in the entire League. Can hit tremendous shots off either foot and is a regular scorer from 25 yards. Signed from Northampton Town by .manager Andrews and a first team regular last season until hit by injury.

PETER SAYER (midfield): Another young local player whose natural talent won him a regular place in the closing weeks of last season — he had started promisingly a year earlier in the Second Division but then been checked by a broken leg at Southampton.

ALAN CAMPBELL (midfield): Signed from Birmingham City just before last season's transfer deadline to bring that extra creative spark in the decisive weeks of the promotion campaign. This former Charlton and Scottish under-23 International proved a vital competitor providing brilliantly manipulated moves that produced critical goals.

DOUGLAS LIVERMORE (midfield): A highly skilled, tirelessly working 'general' with First Division experience at Liverpool — his home town club — and Norwich City. Has now succeeded England as Cardiff's skipper and made an outstanding contribution after being signed a year ago.

WILLIE ANDERSON (front player): Given his League debut as a 16-year-old with Manchester United. Moved to Aston Villa for £20,000 and, some 250 games later, to Ninian Park for £60,000. A dazzling runner with the ball on either wing, he carved out dozens of scoring chances last season — probably his finest since arriving at Cardiff five seasons ago.

DEREK SHOWERS (striker): Joined the club as a 16-year-old from his native Merthyr and was a regular choice in Cardiff's last season in the Second Division — finally ending with caps against England and Northern Ireland in the Home Championship.

TONY EVANS (striker): One of football's success stories last season. Signed on a free transfer from Blackpool and without a first team goal to his credit, he suddenly emerged as one of the game's top strikers.

PETER JACKSON (striker): Where manager Andrews succeeded with Evans, he now hopes to do the same with Jackson. Signed on a free transfer with Leicester City, he was the only new player to arrive pre-season — a young, talented attacker anxious to prove that he can become a busy scorer.

ADRIAN ALSTON (striker): A player of unpredictable brilliance. Immense natural skill which can explode into deceptive shooting and marvellous goals. Born in Preston but first attracted attention as central striker in the Australian team which played in the 1974 World Cupfinals. Then signed for Luton before moving to Cardiff last October.

Coaching

AS A coach working with a collection of promising young players, it may come as a surprise for me to go on record as stating that my main function is not to secure a winning reserve team. That is the first teams goal, to win and win well. The sole aim for Danny Bergara and myself is to produce players good enough to play in and maintain regular League football. To win is a bonus.

In view of this seasons reserve team results some may feel that my statement is a negative conclusion drawn from a succession of defeats. How wrong. As a direct consequence of our financial position, we have been forced to field a reserve side which in the Boss's words, "they are not yet at the shaving stage". They are meeting experienced professionals and facing problems which they must answer immediately, they must show at an early age that they have the character to go with their skill. The learning process is being accelerated.

However, these youngsters face an unequal physical struggle as they concede age, strength and power to the opposition. As a direct result we have lost several games by losing goals in the last twenty minutes when our physical efforts have taken their toll. When muscles tire and fatigue sets in, the ability to produce skill fades and concentration tends to lapse. As we get older, stronger and fitter so we can expect to compete for longer. By the New Year we shall be holding our own and by the seasons end, much to our delight, we shall be winning
