LUTON 'keeper Keith Barber was stretchered off midway through the second-half after saving at the feet of County's Mick Vinter.

He was rushed to Nottingham General Hospital, where it was confirmed he had two broken ribs.

But Barber's general condition is described as "good," and he was expected to be released within 48 hours unless further complications arose.

Despite being without their teeper for the final 20 minutes, Luton skill had the class and goal-power to send County crashing to their heaviest defeat of the season.

The match was a disaster for County after their five-goal destruction of Fulham last week. They failed to overcome the handicap of losing skipper David Needham with a groin injury after only seven minutes.

County folded completely as Luton broke clear, to grab two more goals in the last nine minutes.

McManus was at fault when he failed to hold a shot from Parquale Fuccillo, and substitute Jimmy Husband touched in a simple chance from three vards.

Three minutes later Luton defender Steve Buckley rubbed it in with a cracking 30-yard goal, and County were finished.

Aston booked.
