

LUTON FALTER IN ATTACK

CHESTER reached the Fifth round of the F.A. Cup for the first time in their history with a goal in the closing seconds of a rousing tie.

As Edwards scored from the best-worked move of the match, the crowd behind the Luton goal surged forward, demolishing a barrier wall and spilling into the netting.

The game was held up for some minutes and seven spectators received hospital treatment for minor injuries.

If Luton had the better of the first-half, the evergreen Husband hitting a post and then heading straight at Millington from six yards, the second half belonged to Chester.

The Third Division side allowed the Futchers brothers few opportunities to shine on their return to Sealand Road after an absence of three years.

Apart from his on-going dialogue with the referee, Ron Futchers had a distinctly forgettable match, while Paul, though defending solidly enough, showed little indication of the class for which Luton reportedly paid £100,000.

Aston, who switched wings with Husband in the second-half, mounted a number of dangerous raids and Fuccillo kept the mid-field supply lines open. But Luton's attack was generally far too slow in Chester's penalty box.
