TWO MORE points to keep us in the promotion fight were earned the hard way at Hereford last week, and the result was fair reward for all the hard work that went into the game. I heard some criticism of the way we played, but to be fair to the team. what do people want - they came back with a result, they deserved the points and in the last 16 games we have lost only once. That can't be bad can it?

But I have been sickened by some of the things that have gone on outside of Kenilworth Road in the last few days. I must stress here that these are personal views, and not the Club's, but it's time someone spoke out about some of the idiotic things that have been said by people who should know better.

I refer in particular to an MP, Mr Sedgemore, and to a Mr Franks, who wants to become an MP. They jumped on the bandwagon of complaints about wilful damage done to houses around the ground.

Now I have every sympathy with people who suffer, and I hope that the culprits are caught and hit hard when they appear in court. But the politicians want to see the ground closed down. Mr Sedgemore even thought that Luton Town FC should be punished for the misdeeds of visiting supporters by being relegated.

What good will that do? If a customer from a pub walks home and decides to chuck a brick through a window should we shut all pubs? Should cinemas be closed down because some of their customers get into trouble in the streets outside? It's a funny thing, but while the politicians are bleating like some kind of male voice choir. every country in the western world is trying to solve the problems of hooliganism. It's a general problem, not just a football one. Closing down soccer grounds and ending the pleasure of thousands of decent ordinary people will not help matters. Perhaps the MPs might think about reducing the dole queues, and giving us all a better life.

Anyway, who are MPs to talk about hooliganism. Not so long ago they were fighting in the House of Commons instead. Perhaps the answer is to shut the Houses of Parliament for setting such a bad example!

Mr Sedgemore and Mr Franks might bear something else in mind: we've got 10,000 friends at Luton Town. People who enjoy their football, and cause no trouble. And people who vote at election time.

As a football club we play our part in crowd control. We pay anything up to £700 a match for police services inside the ground. We co-operate fully in helping to get visiting supporters into and out of the ground on routes suggested by the police. We try to be helpful, and it's a pity the politicians can't say things that might also help, instead of trying to stir up bad feelings.



### **Carlisle United**

MICK BARRY: Born Hull. Made his mark with Huddersfield Town from whom he was transferred to Carlisle in May 1973 for a sizeable fee. A midfield player of considerable skill who has represented Wales at Under 23 level. 49 (9 sub) appearances and 7 goals up to the end of last season.

PHIL BONNYMAN: Born Glasgow. A strong determined midfield or back four player who was signed from Hamilton Academical FC for a substantial fee in March 1976. Made 9 appearances up to the end of last season and is expected to make a big impression in his first full season in English football.

MARTIN BÜRLEIGH: Born Willington (Co. Durham). A goalkeeper of great potential. Signed from Darlington for a substantial fee in May 1975 and in his first season with United made a total of 17 appearances. His first professional engagement was with Newcastle United for whom he made a number of First Division appearances.

PETER CARR: Born Ferryhill (Co. Durham). A determined strong tackling defender who has missed few matches since joining the Club for a small fee from Darlington in November 1972. Up to the end of last season he had made 150 (1 sub) appearances.

FRANK CLARKE: Born Willenhall (Staffs). One of four brothers who are all professional footballers, Joined the Club from Ipswich Town for a sizeable fee in August 1973. Has twice been leading scorer for the Club. Also played with Shrewsbury Town and QPR. To the end of last season had made 115 (2 sub) appearances and scored 21 scales.

JOHN LATHAN: Born Sunderland. A midfield or forward player who started his professional career in his home town of Sunderland. Moved on to Mansfield Town and it was from here that he joined United for a moderate fee in February 1976. Up to the end of last season he had made 10 (1 sub) appearances.

MIKE McCARTNEY: Born Edinburgh. Joined the Club on a free transfer from West Bromwich Albion in May 1973. During his first two seasons his appearances were very limited but he earned a place in the team in the early part of last season and just when he looked like establishing himself in one of the midfield positions he sustained a thigh injury which put him on the sidelines for the second half of the season. Is hoping for a change in fortune this season. To the end of 1975-76 he had made 16 (5 sub) appearances and scored 3 goals.

IAN MacDONALD: Born Rinteln (West Germany). Signed from St Johnstone in May 1976 for a sizeable fee. An Under 23 International with two caps against England. At 6' 3" the biggest member of the team. Previously played with Elgin in the Highland League. Had previously attracted the attention of a number of English First Division Clubs.

GEORGE McVITIE: Born Carlisle. The only local born player on the staff. A Schoolboy International who joined the Club straight from school in May 1964. Transferred to West Bromwich Albion in 1970 and subsequently played for Oldham Athletic before returning to Brunton Park for a moderate fee in December 1965. One of the most accurate crossers of a ball in the game. To the end of last

season he had made a total of 161 (6 sub) appearances and scored 28 goals

DENNIS MARTIN: Born Edinburgh. A talented midfield or forward player with an abundance of skill. Came to Carlisle from West Bromwich Albion for a substantial fee in June 1970 shortly after he had helped Albion defeat United in the semi-final of the Football League Cup. To the end of 1975-76 he had made 264 (3 sub) appearances and scored 53 goals.

LES O'NEILL: Born Cramlington (Northumberland). Started his professional career with Newcastle United before moving on to Darlington and Bradford City. Joined United from Bradford for a small fee in May 1972 and in his four seasons with the Club has proved to be an enthusiastic and energetic midfield player. To the end of last season he had made 150 (5 sub) appearances and scored 21 goals.

scored 21 goals.

BOBBY OWEN: Born Bolton. Started his professional career with Bury from whom he moved into the First Division with Manchester City. Had a short spell on loan with Swansea. Joined the Brunton Park staff in June 1970 for a substantial fee from Manchester City. A striker with a proven scoring record who has also operated with success in the back four. Up to the end of last season he had 207 (19 sub) appearances and 58 goals.

BOBBY PARKER: Born Coventry. An England Youth International defender who was signed from his home town Club Coventry City for a Club record fee in June 1974. His appearances last season were restricted through injury. To the end of 1975-76 he had made 72 appearances and scored 1 goal.

EDDIE PRUDHAM: Born Gateshead. Made his mark professionally with Sheffield Wednesday and was transferred to Carlisle from the Yorkshire Club for a sizeable fee in November 1974 after a spell on loan to Scottish Club Partick Thistle. An enthusiastic striker who has not had the best of fortune with injuries during his period with the Club. To the end of last season he had made 15 (2 sub) appearances and scored 3 goals.

BILL RAFFERTY: Born Port Glasgow. This big striker was signed for a substantial fee from Plymouth Argyle in May 1976. His professional career started off at Coventry for whom he played in the First Division and was continued at Blackpool before moving to the south coast Club for whom he had an excellent scoring record.

ALLAN ROSS: Born Glasgow. Is now in his fourteenth season with the Club following his transfer from Luton Town in June 1963. Has been on the fringe of International honours a few seasons ago when called up to travel with the Scottish National side. His 484 appearances in goal up to the end of 1975-76 gives him the Club's leading appearance record. Has also appeared once as substitute in an outfield position!

JOHN SMITH: Born Liverpool. An England Schoolboy International whose only previous professional Club was Everton for whom he made a couple of First Division appearances. Joined United in June 1976 on a free transfer and is looking forward to establishing himself as a regular Football League player. A midfield player with undoubted skill.


