

WITH TODAY'S match coming in the middle of the Easter programme the Second Division promotion battle is still a long way from being settled.

I have had to write this before our game at Stamford Bridge on Saturday. Naturally we all wanted to win there after the disappointment of losing at Southampton.

We came away from the Dell with nothing to show for our efforts, but not for the want of trying. It was one of those days when circumstances went against us.

We missed Alan West's experience in midfield, but I was delighted with the way young Graham Jones slotted into the side. I can't bear to think about how much money Southampton had spent to build up their team. We've had to work on a shoestring budget,

but we still gave them plenty of problems.

I suppose a lot of supporters felt sick about losing to Southampton, especially after we had one shot cleared off the line and then missed a couple of reasonable chances.

But I didn't give the lads a rocket. For one thing, they were only too well aware that they had lost a game which they might well have won.

And anyway you have to lose sometimes, and take defeat with good grace. The lads had put together a run which brought us 23 points out of a possible 24.

It shows the depth of character we have built up in the club. Not so many months ago we were worried about holding the club together at all. Now we've done so well that losing for the first time in 13 games goes down as a disappointment - it's a funny old game isn't it?

I've said all along that we would keep pecking away at the teams above us. We concentrate on our matches, without worrying too much about the others. At different times I have heard it said that this team or that were certainties for promotion. But it's turned out to be a tough fight, with plenty of clubs in with a chance.

I won't give up hope until the last ball is kicked on the last match of the season, and if we collect two points today at Orient's expense so much the better!

DOUG ALLDER: A natural left-winger who progressed through Millwall's youth side and gained England Youth honours. A regular in the 'Lion's' League side when only a teenager. Switched to midfield with the arrival of Gordon Hill. Almost 200 League appearances for Millwall before joining Orient in July 1975.

PETER ALLEN: Orient's longest serving player. Joined the Club as an amateur, turning professional in July 1965 having been associated with Spurs as a schoolboy. Testimonial season last year when he set a new "O's" League appearance record of 376 matches.

PETER BENNETT: Joined Orient from West Ham in October 1970. After 39 first team appearances for the 'Hammers' he moved to Orient and became Club Captain.

DEREK CLARKE: Joined Orient from Oxford United in August and made his debut at Bolton. One of four Clarke brothers playing League football, he began his career with Walsall and after a spell with Wolves moved to Oxford United in 1970.

LAURIE CUNNINGHAM: Signed as an apprentice in August 1972. His skilful wing play made him a star of Orient's successful youth team of 1973-74. Turned professional in March 1974 and made his first team debut against West Ham in the Texaco Cup, August 1974.

MIKE EVERETT: Joined the "O's" as a non-contract player in February 1976 and made his League debut when he took the field during the second-half of the home game with Fulham later that month. Signed professional in March 1976.

BOBBY FISHER: Former apprentice, who signed professional in August 1973 and made his League debut at Sunderland in the same month. A midfield player who switched to full-back in the League side two years ago.

NIGEL GRAY: Joined Orient as an Associated Schoolboy and then signed apprentice on leaving school in July 1973. Signed professional in April 1974. Made his League debut v Bolton in April 1975.

TONY GREALISH: Another product of West London's schools' football. Signed apprentice in June 1972. Made his League debut against Sheffield Wednesday in September 1974 as substitute. The Club's "Young Player of the Year" in 1976.

RICKY HEPPOLETTE: Spent his childhood in Bolton joining Preston North End as an apprentice. Made 154 appearances for Preston before joining Orient for around £40 000 in December 1972.

GARY HIBBS: Another product of West London schools' football and the Orient's Youth scheme. Spotted by the "O's" when playing for the local youth team and signed apprentice in May 1972. Progressed through the Youth sides and was the Club's "Young Player of the Year" in 1973-74. Full professional in February 1974.

PHIL HOADLEY: A former Youth international, gained First Division experience with Crystal Palace before moving to Orient in September 1971, for a then record fee of £30,000. Full back or centre back.

JOHN JACKSON: Signed professional for Palace in 1962 and made his first appearance in August 1964. Over 350 League games and represented the Football League while at Selhurst Park. Joined Orient in October 1973, and made his League debut v Luton Town.

DAVID PAYNE: Joined Crystal Palace and made League debut in October 1964. After over 300 games with Palace,

joined Orient for around £20,000 in August 1973. Injury kept him out of the team until the second half of last season.

DEREK POSSEE: Began his professional career with Tottenham Hotspur before moving to Millwall in 1967. After 223 Division Two games for Millwall, he moved to Crystal Palace and then Orient in July 1974 for £60,000. GERRY QUEEN: Transferred to Crystal Palace from Kilmarnock in 1969 for £40,000, and played 101 matches for them before moving to Orient for a Club record fee of around £60,000 in October 1972.

GLENN ROEDER: Made his first team debut v Notts County in March 1975 after signing professional in October 1973. Plays either in midfield or centre-back.

BILL ROFFEY: Local boy who has progressed through the Club's Youth scheme. Has benefitted from expert coaching by John Jackson. Over 160 appearances for the Club but yet to make his League debut.

ALAN WHITTLE: Made his debut as a teenager for Everton who he helped to the First Division title in 1970. Gained under 23 honours and made 72 League appearances, scoring 21 goals with Everton. Moved to Crystal Palace in November 1972 and played 103 League games and was in the team that reached the FA Cup semi-finals last season. Joined the "O's" in September 1976.






