You will have gathered from the recent arrivals at the club that I have made the decision to bring new faces to Eastville.

The aim is to introduce fresh competition for places so that everyone has to go flat our for a position in the first team.

The decision had to be made quickly and did not give me a great deal of opportunity to do much homework on the players themselves but I feel confident they will prove good assets.

In the case of Tony Taylor, he has the experience of 200 games in the First Division behind him - a good pedigree - while still being young enough to have a few more seasons left as a first team player.

ATTITUDE

Both are the enthusiastic type of player and if they can produce what I know they are capable of, I am sure they will both prove very popular with you, the fans.

In the case of young Jimmy Brown, formerly with Hibs, he has shown the potential to develop into a good first team player and has earned the chance to prove himself by working hard during his six weeks on trial with us.

RESPONSE

All new signings inject fresh life into a club, giving the manager different permutations and bringing a response from the players already on the staff.

FOUR-TIME HUSBAND

Luton come here today after two quite remarkable victories which have sent their confidence soaring and made every other club in the country sit up and take notice.

Outstanding performance number one was a 3-1 victory over First Division Wolves and Molineux in the League Cup.

They followed that with a sensational 7-1 drubbing of Charlton at Kenilworth Road four days later.

Leading the way in both game was 29 year old JIMMY HUSBAND who scored five goals in the two matches - four against Charlton.

Husband joined Luton in November 1973 from Everton for a £70,000 fee and now links up in a front line with PHIL BOERSMA and RON FUTCHER.

Boersma, who missed the Charlton game with a hamstring injury, was signed during the summer from Middlesborough for £35,000. He previously played for Liverpool.

Ron Futcher has recently returned from playing in America and has replaced former Manchester United man **JOHN ASTON**.

Futcher's brother **PAUL**, an England under 21 international, is at the heart of the Luton defence. The brothers joined the club in June 1974 from Chester with Paul costing £100,000.

Also in the back four are **JOHN FAULKNER** who joined the club in 1972 from Leeds United, **STEVE BUCKLEY**, a £5,000 signing from Burton Albion, and **PAUL PRICE**, who made his debut in April 1973.

In midfield, Luton have **ALAN WEST** the former England under 23 international signed from Burnley in October 1973 for £80,000.

RICKY HILL is a former apprentice who made his League debut against Rovers at Kenilworth Road in April last year when he came on as substitute and scored in a 3-1 Luton win.

PASQUALE 'LIL' FUCCILLO is another ex-apprentice who made his League debut back in 1974 when Luton were in Division One.

Luton's first team squad goalkeepers are MILIJIA (pronounce it Melia) ALEKSIC, signed from Plymouth Argyle in January for £20,000 and KEITH BARBER who first played for the club's League side in April 1971.
