Scraping home by a late goal from £90,000 bargain buy striker, Frank Worthington, Bolton won a torrid championship game

But they have yet to prove they have improved enough from the last two seasons when they so narrowly missed promotion. Bolton still falter when they meet a team of real class such as Luton, who, although gradually outstayed by Bolton, look the better bet to survive in the top flight.

To realise his dreams Luton manager Harry Haslam will have to get his team up this season because he surely cannot hold on much longer to the Futchers twins. Defender Paul was the man of the match, and Ron, after scoring a goal that McDonagh should have saved in the seventh minute, always looked dangerous.

But Bolton have made a sound buy in Worthington. He refused to panic when the pressure was on, and responded with his fifth goal in six games since arriving from Leicester—a well-judged far post header after 82 minutes from a Morgan cross.

And it was Morgan, after 52 minutes, who equalised with a fine volley from a Greaves-Whatmore move.
