

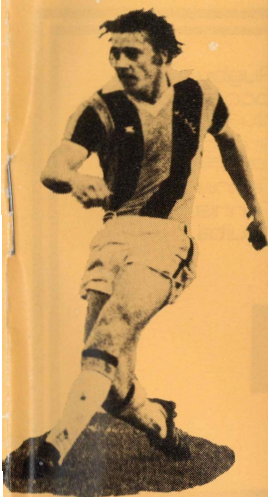

Ken's Comments

Our wishes for a good and Happy Easter got off to a pretty good start with a well deserved point at Blackburn, who are flying high near the top of the League. Things weren't too good against Notts County, and we had to settle, again, for a draw. On the Easter Monday there was a vast deterioration in our display against Oldham, who hadn't been doing too well themselves of late. We were looking for, and hopeful of getting five, or at least four points out of the six, instead of the meagre two we have had to settle for.

In the Blackburn match we saw examples which illustrated how things have been going for us lately, when Alan Warboys hit the post twice and had a good goal disallowed for offside with a Blackburn defender lying in the goalmouth. We played well and were full of fight despite the setbacks, and it was Blackburn who felt that they themselves were fortunate to have held out for a point.

Last Saturday we gave Notts County an Easter gift in the form of a simple goal. We lost heart a little and it showed in our game and it was only in the last twenty minutes or so that we played as well as what we are capable of, and were rewarded when Billy Bremner got the equaliser and then, later, nearly the winner. A word of praise is rightly called for here, as it was a tonic to hear you fans, once again cheering the lads on in their efforts. You are doing your part in the fight to stave off the 'drop'.

We were hoping to travel along the M62 to Oldham with four points already in the bag and this would have given us a real boost of needed confidence. This was not to be, and we never got into our stride. The whole match was disappointing and a big let down for the fans who travelled to support us. The goal, just after half-time, killed us off after we had matched them during the first half. Again we lost heart and accepted defeat, despite a great Billy Bremner equalising goal. We did not look like scoring again, but it took a real cracker of a shot to hammer home the final nail in our coffin of the afternoon.

Our position is now desperate and as draws are no good to us at this stage, we have to throw caution to the wind and attack in the search for goals, and yet we must try and not leave ourselves wide open at the back to face counter attacks.

I hope you will enjoy this afternoon's match.

Four successive away defeats in recent weeks have put Luton Town right out of the promotion race and they must now resign themselves to at least one more season in Division II to which they returned in 1975 after they had won promotion just a year earlier.

Soon after slipping into Division II, came news of financial problems that seemed to be threaten-

ing their very existence as a Football club and after a shock such as this it was a considerable feat last season to climb as high as sixth in Division II and to be in with a chance of promotion with a month of the season to go. This followed one of the best runs in the club's history when they picked up 23 points from 12 games from January onwards.

Sudden reverses of fortune have been very much part and parcel of Luton's experience since they were first elected to the Football League in 1897. After three seasons they lost their Division II place and had to wait until the foundation of Division III in 1920 before they could climb back again into the Football League. Then in 1927 they won promotion back to Division II and after a long spell they were promoted to Division I for the first time ever in 1955.

They stayed there for five seasons, but then came a steady decline which ended up with them in Division IV in 1965 to give them the doubtful distinction of being the first former Division I team to play in Division IV.

It then took them just nine seasons to climb back up to Division I again and though they did not manage to hold on to their place the feat in climbing there was a remarkable one and the momentum from it has not been completely lost.

This season, probably their outstanding feat was a League Cup win at Wolverhampton in August whilst in the League games they have won at Bristol Rovers, Cardiff and Southampton and have also drawn at Sunderland, Crystal Palace, Orient and Charlton. At home they have lost four times, to Stoke, Oldham, Burnley and Spurs.

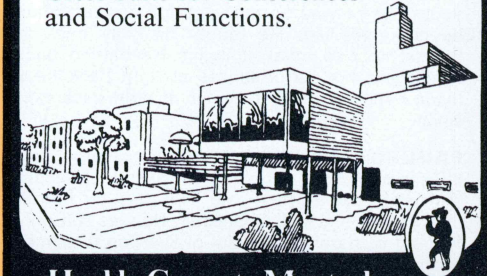
The most heroic story to come from Luton or in fact from anywhere else this season is the recovery of key defender Paul Futcher from the serious car accident that early this season put his life in danger for some time. Now happily he is playing again while his twin brother Ron is likely to be in the front line. Jimmy Husband, who scored the Hull goal when we drew 1-1 there in November has since moved to Memphis, but another experienced player who has been scoring regularly in recent weeks is Phil Boersma, formerly of Liverpool, Wrexham and Middlesbrough.

PAUL PRICE. His hopes of a career in League soccer had to overcome a double disaster before he made the grade. Recruited by Luton as a youngster he was on the verge of success when he broke his leg. He fought his way back to fitness, only to break it again. He battled back again, and his performances at right back have made him Luton's first-choice at right back ever since.

PAUL FUTCHER. One of the brightest prospects in League football today, Luton risked their record transfer fee when they paid £100,000 for him in the summer of 1974 to Chester. He was still only 17, and with only a handful of Division IV games behind him.

DAVID CARR. After learning his trade in defence or midfield in youth and reserve teams, Carr is now competing for regular first team football. He comes from Margate, and became an apprentice at Luton when he left school in 1973.

JIM McNICHOL. Former manager Harry Haslam is used to looking for bargains, and defender McNichol rates as one. Ipswich, prolific producers of youth players, allowed him to look for a new club after ending his apprenticeship at Portman Road in the summer of 1976.

GRAHAM JONES. Watched by a Luton scout while playing as a schoolboy in Manchester, Jones was signed as an apprentice in the summer of 1975. Big and brave, he made rapid strides through Luton's lower teams, and made his league debut at the age of 17.

MILIJA ALEKSIC. Luton paid £20,000 to Plymouth in January 1977 for Aleksic's services, and the fee turned out to be a bargain. Aged 24, he was unsettled at Plymouth, and the move to Luton turned out to be the turning point in his career. Son of Yugoslav parents, but born in the North of England, he broke into football as a part-timer with Stafford Rangers.

PASQUALE FUCCILLO. Son of Italian parents who settled at Bedford, midfield dynamo Fuccillo joined Luton as a 16 year old apprentice in the summer of 1973. Strong on the ball, he made his name with some storming midfield displays, and marked his league debut with a goal and has been a regular marksman ever since.

ALAN WEST. Luton's club captain and a brilliant midfield man, West is one of the many stars to emerge from the "production line" of Burnley. An England Under-23 international, he joined Luton for £100,000 from Burnley in October 1973. Still only 25, he is capable of turning defences inside-out with accurate passes.

RICKY HILL. A midfield player who has excited attention all over the country, Hill had a fairy-tale start to his league career. Signed as an apprentice from schools football in North London, he made it into the league team within a year and celebrated his debut by scoring once and laying on another goal. Now 19, he has been capped by England at youth level.

PHIL BOERSMA. It was the end of a patient search for talent by ex-Luton boss Harry Haslam, signed striker Boersma from Middlesbrough in July 1977. Three years previously Haslam had tried to persuade Liverpool to part with the player. He failed, and later went to Middlesbrough, and Haslam finally got his man two years later.

RON FUTCHER. Twin brother of Paul and identical in looks. When Luton paid £25,000 for him it was thought that he had been transferred from Chester because the boys wanted to be together, but Ron soon made his mark with a hat-trick in his second Division I game and has since established himself in Luton's front line.

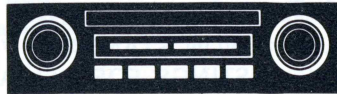
