Within five minutes the Os were back on terms with a fluke debut goal from Ralph Coates. Ian Moores sent him clear on the left and his cross looped into the Luton box. Paul Price looked to have it covered but inexplicably ducked out of the way and Alecic could only watch as the ball swerved into the net. The Os fans didn't know whether to laugh or cheer.

Ian Moores headed into the 'keeper's hands and Kitchen turned a shot into the side netting as Orient kept pushing forward but Luton were equally dangerous and in the 42nd minute Turner headed wide of an empty net after Bob Hatton had roasted Nigel Gray on the left.

The game continued in much but it was Orient who carved out the better openings. In the 54th minute Tony Cralish fired a great chance over the top and five minutes later Moores turned Henry Hughton's cross into the net but the goal was disallowed for a foul on the 'keeper.

Then Coates, who was an inspiration in midfield, sent Bill Roffey clear on the left. The cross found Kitchen perfectly positioned at the near post but his powerful header was turned round the post by Alecsic.

Orient kept on battling and were eventually rewarded with the lead. Moores was felled outide the box, Coates' far post cross was headed back across goal by Joe Mayo and Kitchen dived low to head h ome through a melee of defenders.

A minute later Orient should have had a third. Mayo dispossessed West in midfield. strode forward, rounded Alecsic but was then felled by Hal Donaghy. Even Luton boss David Pleat admitted afterwards that Orient should have had a penalty but it made no difference to the final outcome for the 74th minute Kitchen notched his seond.
