It looked as if Luton had decided at half-time that the game was there for the taking, when a Stein diving header was ruled fractionally offside, and then the same player had a long snapshot well saved by Siddall.

However, to the relief of the home supporters Sunderland scraped into the lead after 69 minutes. A Buckley cross from the right was headed on by Chisholm, and Rostron gave Findlay no chance from 10 yards.

With only four minutes left, Siddall kept the two points safe with a great save from Taylor, who had broken clear.
