

AIZLEWOOD OF LUTON SENT OFF

WREXHAM, with the Dai Davies sending off at West Ham still a talking point in the valleys, were involved in another dismissal, at the Racecourse Ground yesterday — but this time it was Luton's Mark Aizlewood who was the one to suffer.

With 12 minutes remaining, Hill's header clearly hit the hand of Joey Jones in the Wrexham penalty area, but referee Colin Seel waved away appeals for a penalty as the ball was played to the other end.

When the ball finally ran dead, amid a storm of protest, defender Aizlewood was shown the red card for continued dissent.

Earlier Luton had seen another penalty appeal rejected when debut defender Frankie Jones seemed to climb all over Hatton.

Wrexham, claiming their first win in eight games, had lived dangerously after taking a 31st-minute lead through a brilliantly angled half-volley from teenager Buxton.

Reduced to 10 men, Luton seldom troubled Wrexham, who clinched victory in the 82nd minute when Williams scored his first League goal with a well-placed header from Buxton's centre.
