LUTON's championship celebrations developed into an anti-climax at Kenilworth Road this afternoon when Barnsley snatched the lead with a 49th minute penalty.

The Town showed the form which has taken them into the First Division only on brief occasions in the second half — and the visitors lead came as no surprise.

Barnsley travelled from Yorkshire looking for the three points and for much of the match looked as though they deserved them.

They showed a tigerish approach to the game and anything Luton tried to pull the game from ruins

was met by a determined Barnsley defence.

Barnsley went in front when Jake Findlay hauled down Alan Birch and he successfully beat the keeper to leave Luton fighting an uphill battle.

But three minutes from the end, Brian Stein salvaged a point when he beat Bobby Horn with an excellent shot.
