A corner by Moss had Saints in trouble after 10 minutes. Goodyear flicked it on to the far post where Walsh was desperately close to getting a decisive touch.


Play was held up briefly when Goodyear went down in some discomfort after a challenge by Williams, but the Luton centre-half soon recovered.


It enabled Saints to take a corner and Armstrong's kick was headed dangerously backwards by Stevens, forcing Findlay to stretch back to tip over the crossbar.
