It continues to frustrate me that over the same period last season, we managed to collect just one point.

Hopefully, history will not repeat itself and although some people seem to be taking it for granted that we are now free from relegation worries, I am not among them.

As far as I am concerned, we still need a couple more points to be absolutely safe. That's our immediate target but I'm anxious to see us finish with more points and a better league position than last season.

Judging by our last three performances, the signs are encouraging. Individually and collectively we didn't play well at Birmingham but I'm not unhappy about what I've seen since then.

But we applied ourselves much better at Stoke, were good winners against West Bromwich Albion on Easter Monday and looked a solid team at Ipswich.

If the performance is right, you don't lose many matches and hopefully we have regained a

reasonable level after a disappointing spell in March.

It would be nice to think that sometime between now and the end of the season we will actually have a full-strength squad of players to choose from.

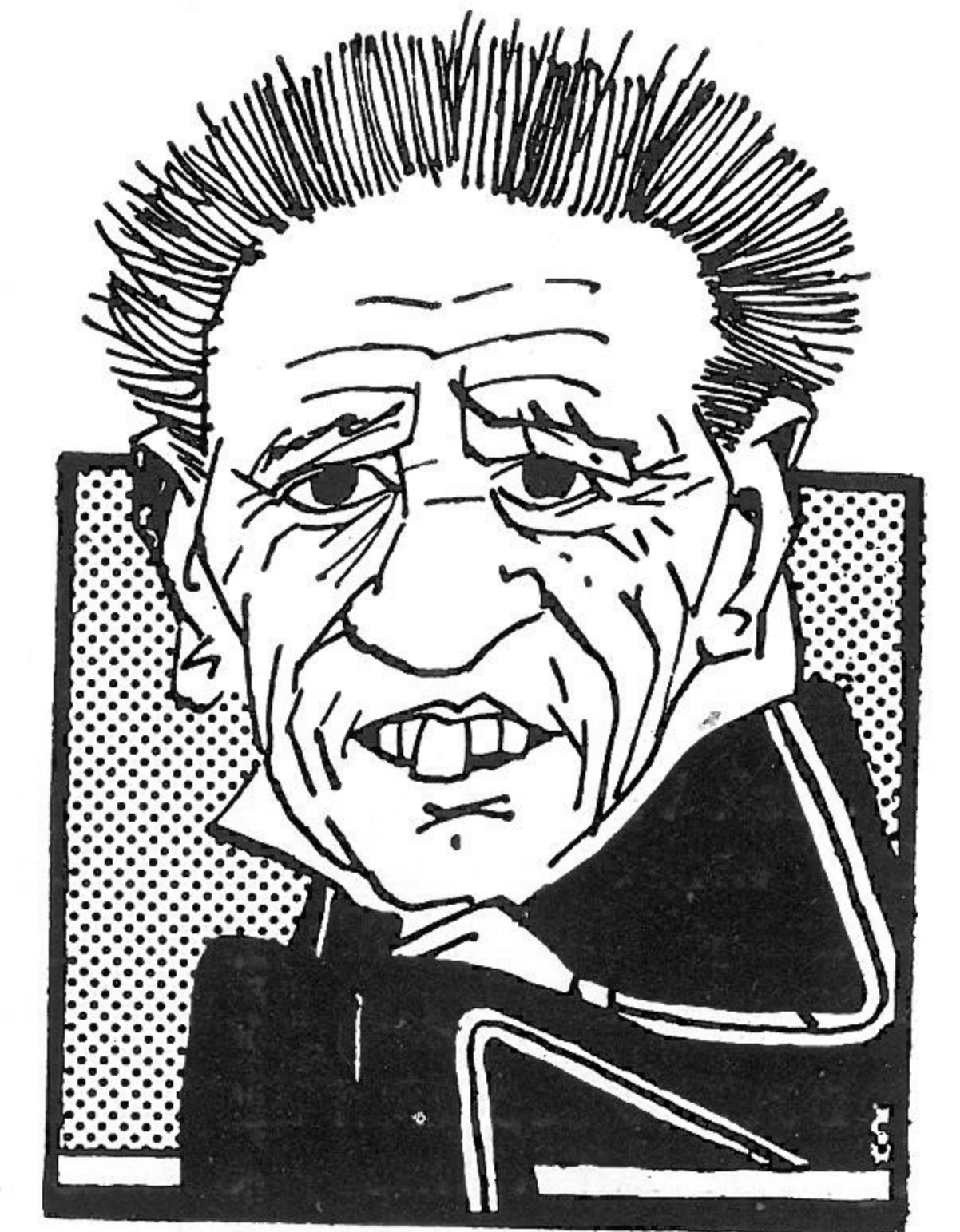
Gordon Mair and Rachid Harkouk have both played three matches in the past week and it seems they are well on the way back to full fitness.

That only leaves Justin Fashanu on the list of long-term casualties and as he was due to see a hospital specialist about his leg injury on Thursday, I'm optimistic that he will soon be available again.

Injuries and suspensions have created a number of problems for us recently and on the law of averages, we are due for a break.

Having taken four points from our last two games, hopefully we can build on that and put together an unbeaten run.

But for the moment, our only concern is Luton Town and as points are absolutely vital to them, they are certain to provide stiff opposition this afternoon.

# ACTION REPLAY

## Jack Wheeler recalls his most memorable match

Jack Wheeler was renowned as one of the most reliable goalkeepers in the country during his playing days with Birmingham City and Huddersfield Town.

But the occasion he played outside-left against Alf Ramsey comes immediately to mind when pressed to recall his most memorable match.

That was in 1954 against Tottenham at White Hart Lane and Huddersfield were leading 1-0 when Wheeler was involved in a calamity midway through the first half.

He explained: "I dived at someone's feet and knew instantly that my left-arm had been broken. The trainer put a crepe bandage on it and told me to carry on but when Len Duquemin equalised, his shot struck my bad arm and almost took me into the net with it.

"There was no way I could continue so they sent me out in the second half with my arm in a sling to play on the left wing and we managed to hang on for a 1-1 draw."

That was a memorable occasion for Wheeler and so it was in 1938 when mighty Arsenal arrived at St. Andrew's with a team containing seven current internationals.

It was a daunting prospect for the 18-years-old goalkeeper making only his second league appearance for Birmingham and Wheeler recalls: "I had seen Arsenal at Villa a few weeks earlier and Ted Drake scored seven goals in that game.

"Arsenal were the best team in the country without a doubt at that time and had just smashed the transfer record by paying £14,000 for Bryn Jones.

"We lost that game 2-0 — Drake scored them both — but I must have done reasonably well because I managed to keep my place."

Wheeler remembers with regret how, during his Huddersfield days in 1955, Len White produced a dramatic late equaliser from Bobby Mitchell's cross in the sixth round of the F.A. Cup.

Two goals in extra time gave Newcastle victory in the replay and he said: "That was the best chance I ever had of reaching the final."

Wheeler, of course, has seen it all at Meadow Lane over the past 26 years, making more than 1,000 consecutive league "appearances" in various capacities.

But two matches take pride of place in his thoughts — two of the great occasions in County's long history.

"The first one that comes to mind was when we went to Leeds in 1976 and beat them in the League Cup. They were a great side at the time and on paper, we hadn't a hope.

"Bill Brindley had turned out for the Reserves the night before and injured a thigh but he had to play because Eric Probert wasn't fit. But he responded to the challenge . . . and so did the others.

"The ultimate, though, must be winning at Chelsea to clinch our place in the First Division because that was the fulfilment of all our dreams.

It's unbelievable to think how far this club has come since the days when we used to go to Accrington and Gateshead."

Aki Lahtinen this week put club before country in an effort to establish a regular first-team place at Meadow Lane.

Finland play Poland in a European Championship match in Warsaw tomorrow and Lahtinen, happily now restored to full fitness, was in line for his 28th international appearance.

But he said: "I was anxious to play against Luton and although I tried to make arrangements to fly straight to Warsaw after the game, it was not possible to complete the journey in time.

"It is important to me to try and establish myself with Notts so as Finland have no chance of qualifying from their group, the international manager told me to stay in Nottingham."

Paul Manns, released by the Magpies on a free transfer in February, looks like winning the battle to re-build his career.

He's currently operating in midfield with Fourth Division Chester and with two goals in his first four appearances, Manns has made quite an impact at Sealand Road.

He said: "The manager, John Sainty, rang me a couple of days after I left Notts and invited me to play in the Reserves. I must have done reasonably well because he immediately picked me for the first team.

"I'm with Chester until the end of the season as a non-contract player and hopefully, I can make a big enough impression to earn a proper contract."

The Magpies have accepted an invitation to go into Europe next month when they take an Under-20's team to compete in the Blau-Wit Tournament.

They will link up with Forest, Luton and Coventry as England's representatives in the prestigious Dutch event from May 20th-24th.

Said coach Mick Walker: "We have taken part in the tournament for the past two years and it offers invaluable experience to the young players.

"The standards are very high and although it involves the club in some expense, it is money well spent as far as I'm concerned."

David Clarke's hamstring injury forced him to withdraw from the England Youth squad for this week's game against Belgium.

And now the youngster must sweat it out, hoping the absence hasn't harmed his chances of adding to his collection of international caps.

The UEFA Championships are being staged in this country next month and Clarke said: "I'm desperate to be in the team for those matches.

## Luton in sight of safety

The emotional scenes at Kenilworth Road last Saturday were reminiscent of 12 months earlier when Luton Town clinched promotion to the First Division.

But survival is now the name of the game for David Pleat's men . . . and that victory against Aston Villa gave players and fans alike a glimmer of hope.

David Moss's injury-time winner not only provided Luton's first home win since Christmas but also ended a run of four consecutive defeats.

And if that dramatic goal does inspire them to claw their way to safety, the end-of-season cheers won't just be confined to Kenilworth Road.

Their refreshing style of play has earned praise and admiration throughout the country and Pleat deserves great credit for sticking to his principles during times of trouble.

Even though it could be claimed that their attacking approach has been the root of Luton's problems, there's been no suggestion of switching the accent onto defence.

When the manager jokingly said before the start of the season that Luton would score 70 goals and concede 100, little could he have realised his prediction would almost come true.

Although star striker Brian Stein has missed four months of the season with a troublesome foot injury, the goals have continued to flow.

But that applied at both ends of the pitch and Pleat was forced to take steps to tighten the leakiest defence in the First Division.

He did so — not by pulling extra men back but by introducing fresh players in a do-or-die action just before the transfer deadline.

Experienced goalkeeper Tony Godden was loaned from West Bromwich Albion and Pleat paid Charlton a six-figure fee for Paul Elliott, rated one of the best young central defenders in the country.

And when the manager could wait no longer for Stein to return to action, he returned to South London to buy striker Trevor Aylott from Millwall.

Aylott, who was previously with Barnsley and Chelsea, has settled in well at Kenilworth Road and his style compliments fellow-strikers Paul Walsh and David Moss.

Walsh, a summer signing from Charlton, made a dramatic start to his Luton career . . . as we well remember.

But despite grabbing a brilliant hat-trick as Luton inflicted our first defeat of the season in September, the lively young striker has struggled to maintain a consistent scoring output.

Moss was also among the scorers in that eventful 5-3 victory against us and with his skill and ability to turn chances into goals, he's always a menacing opponent.

Luton's driving force in midfield is the experienced Brian Horton, who has fully justified Pleat's faith in him.

Horton was bought from Brighton at the start of last season in the hope that he would inspire a promotion success and help settle the club in the top flight.

He's done just that and at the same time, has had a major influence on the development of Ricky Hill who is now recognised as one of the classiest and most creative midfield players around.

The versatile pair of Wayne Turner and Yugoslav Raddy Antic have also carried out their share of midfield duties in recent weeks.

Kirk Stephens is now re-established in the right back position and playing well after a spell out of favour while former Fulham and Liverpool player Richard Money is a regular at No. 3.

That's the shirt that used to belong automatically to Northern Ireland international Mal Donaghy but after figuring in a variety of positions lately, it seems he has now settled down alongside Elliott.

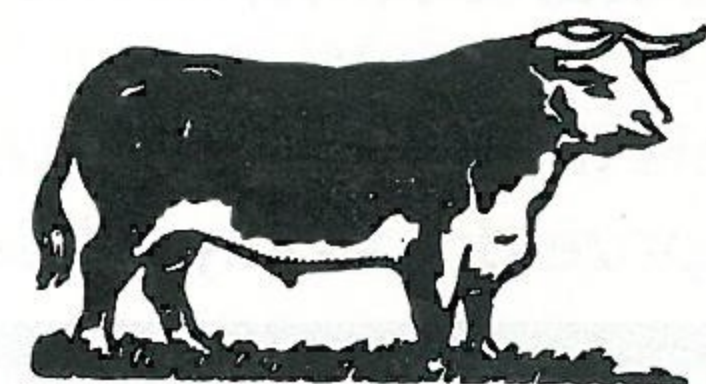

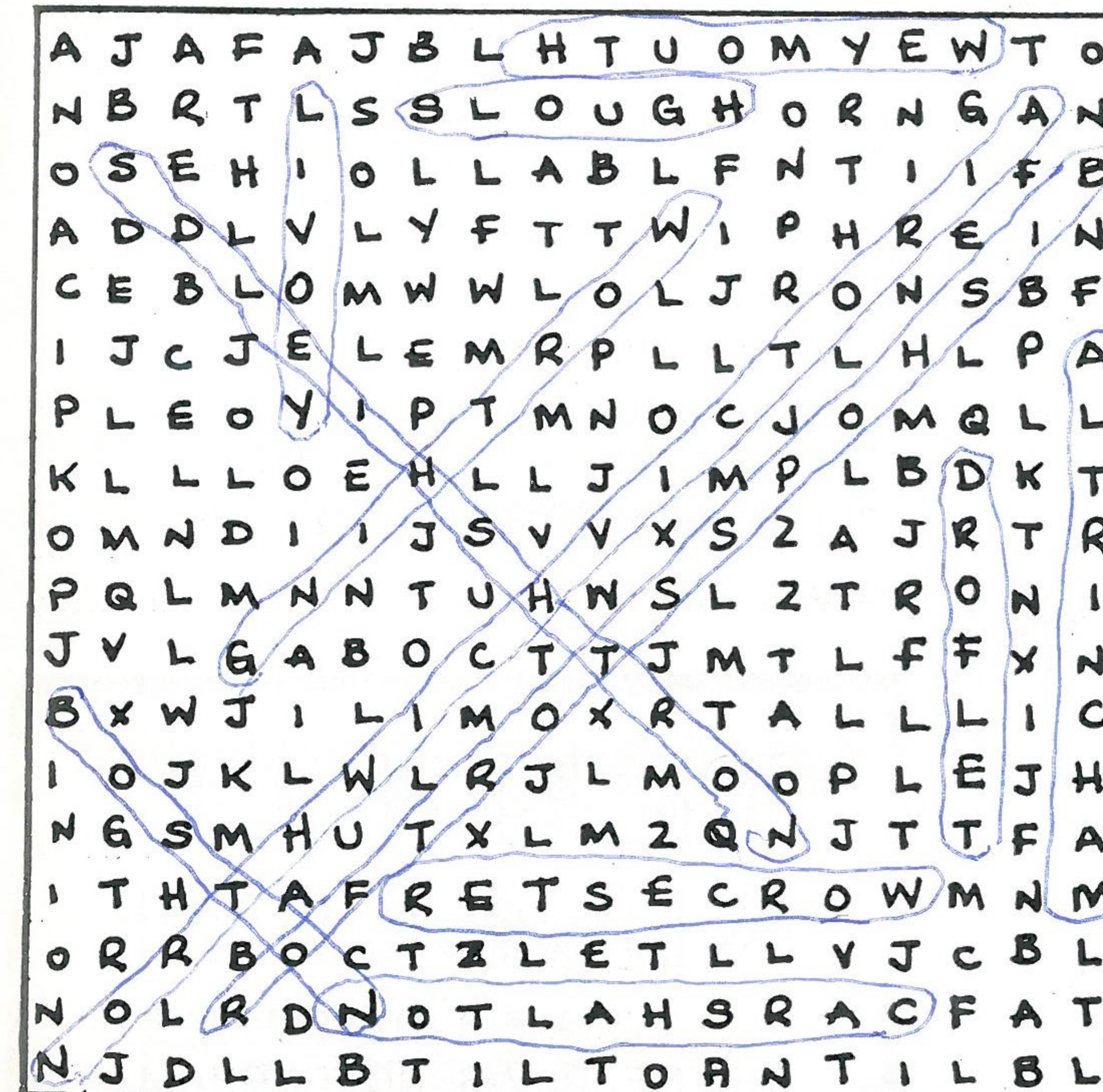

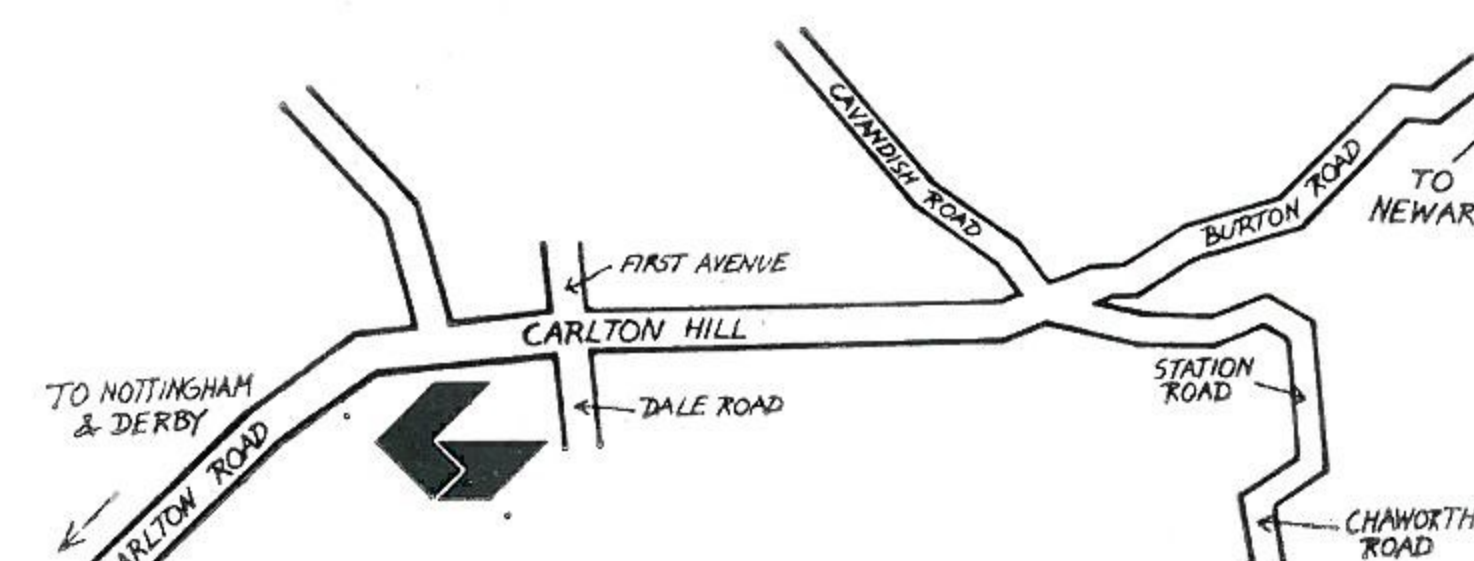

THE POINT Notts gained from the goalless draw at Ipswich on Saturday was another extremely valuable one in the continuing battle to ensure First Division safety, a battle which Notts seem well capable of winning with some ease. So what has all the fuss been about since?

The bother began at the Press conference immediately after the game which turned out to be a more strenuously contested affair than the uninspiring match which preceded it!

I do not think I have known two rougher Press conferences than those on successive Saturdays at Stoke and Ipswich, and both followed much the same pattern as Jimmy Sirrel and Howard Wilkinson had a free for all with local and national writers, who charged them with employing negative and boring tactics.

Who has come the better out of the lively exchanges it is difficult to judge, but you can be assured that the games have been discussed with all the intensity of a heated shop floor confrontation.

By coincidence I think these occasions can only be set into some sort of context by reference to what occurred in the Press conference at Luton in September, after Notts had lost 5-3.

Most of the Press, reflecting I think what most spectators felt, were enthusiastic about a rip-roaring 90 minutes, full of lively action and plenty of goals.

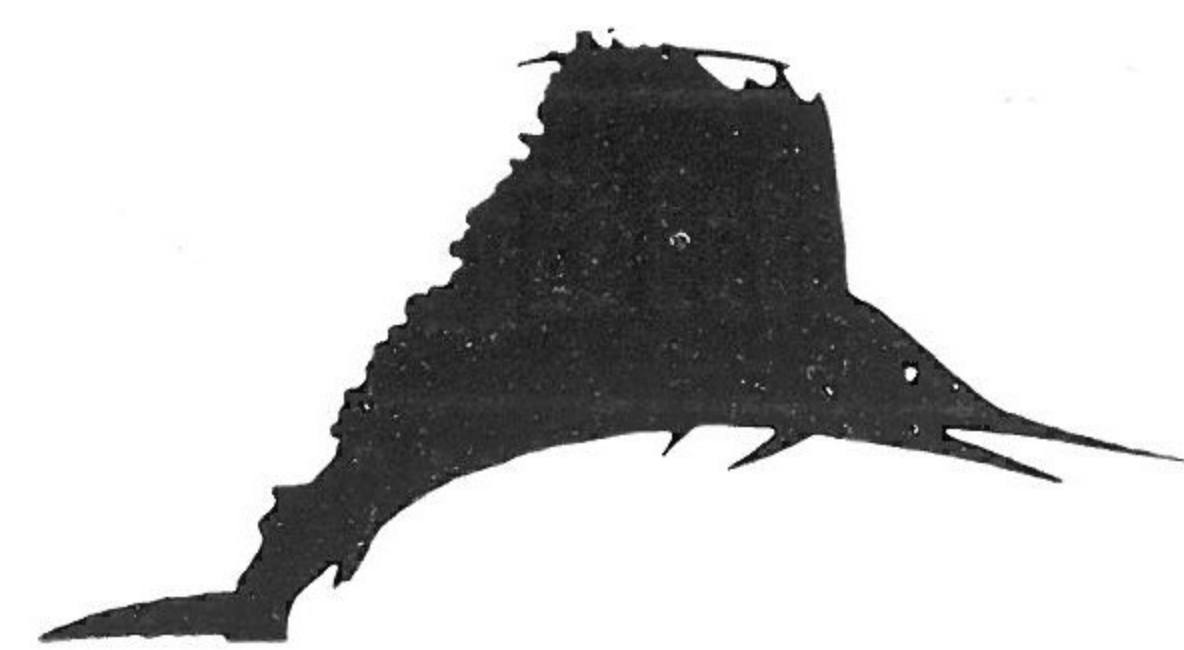
Jimmy and Howard somewhat stunned those around them at the Press conference by not sharing in the general euphoria. They quickly made it plain that many more results like that one, and any continuing tendency to surrender easy goals, would be no good for County's future, or their own.

One writer was so taken aback by their different opinion that he asked Jimmy whether he wasn't proud to have participated in such a game and, in the context of defeat, the Notts manager said quite simply: "No."

In a much more recent radio interview Sunderland manager Alan Durban, accused of playing unimaginative football, said his first responsibility was to the football club which employs him — a club which was languishing at the bottom of the First Division at Christmas but which now looks certain to stay in the top flight after a healthy revival.

Messrs. Sirrel and Durban have effectively been owning up to the classic dilemma facing football chiefs. They all **want** their teams to entertain but they all **need** their teams to achieve a certain level of points, and sometimes the two aims are incompatible, given a shortage of real quality players.

Durban made the point that other clubs' supporters would have been much happier with Sunderland's displays if they had continued to play as they did at Watford early in the season, when they crashed by eight goals. But he isn't paid to get results like that.

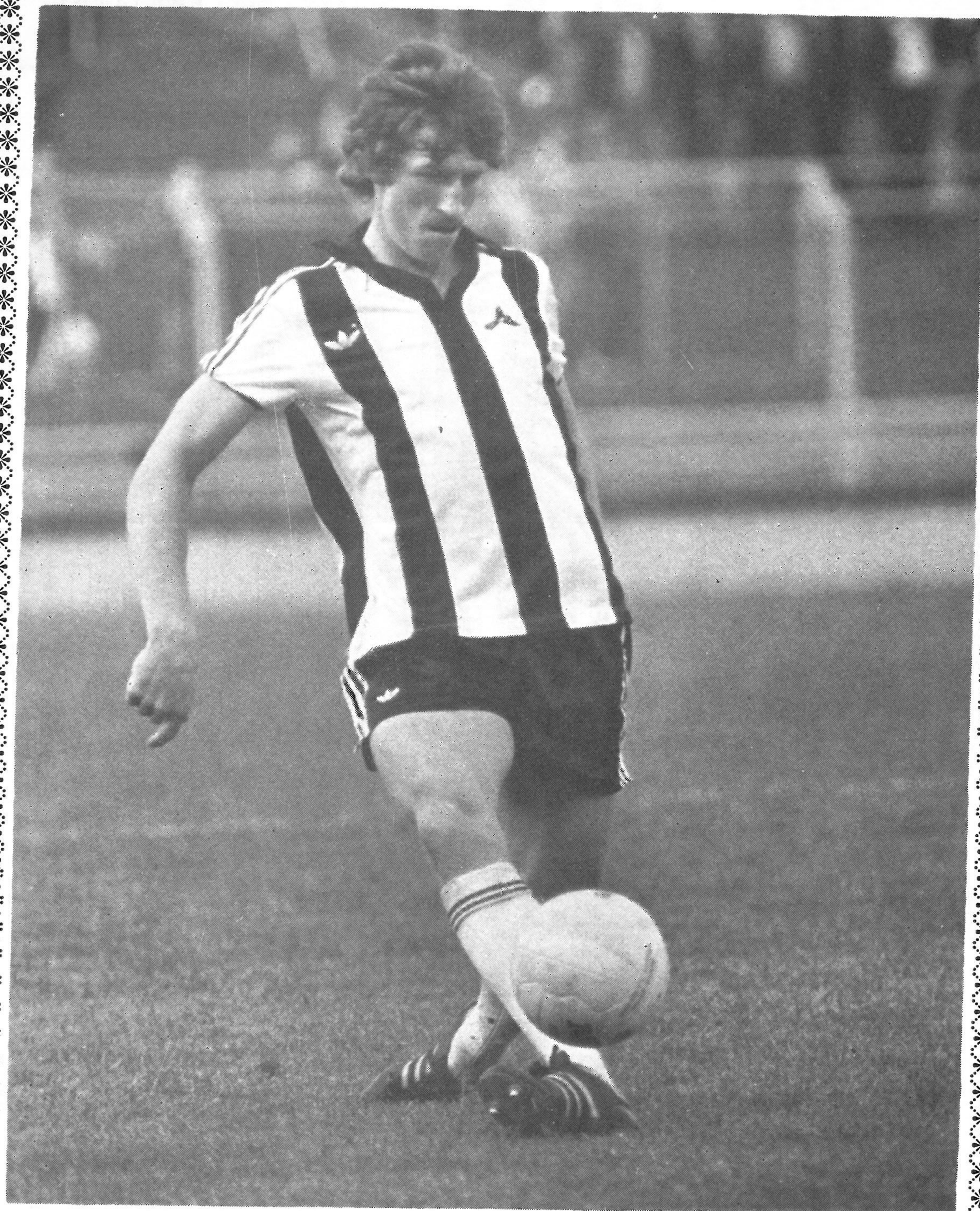

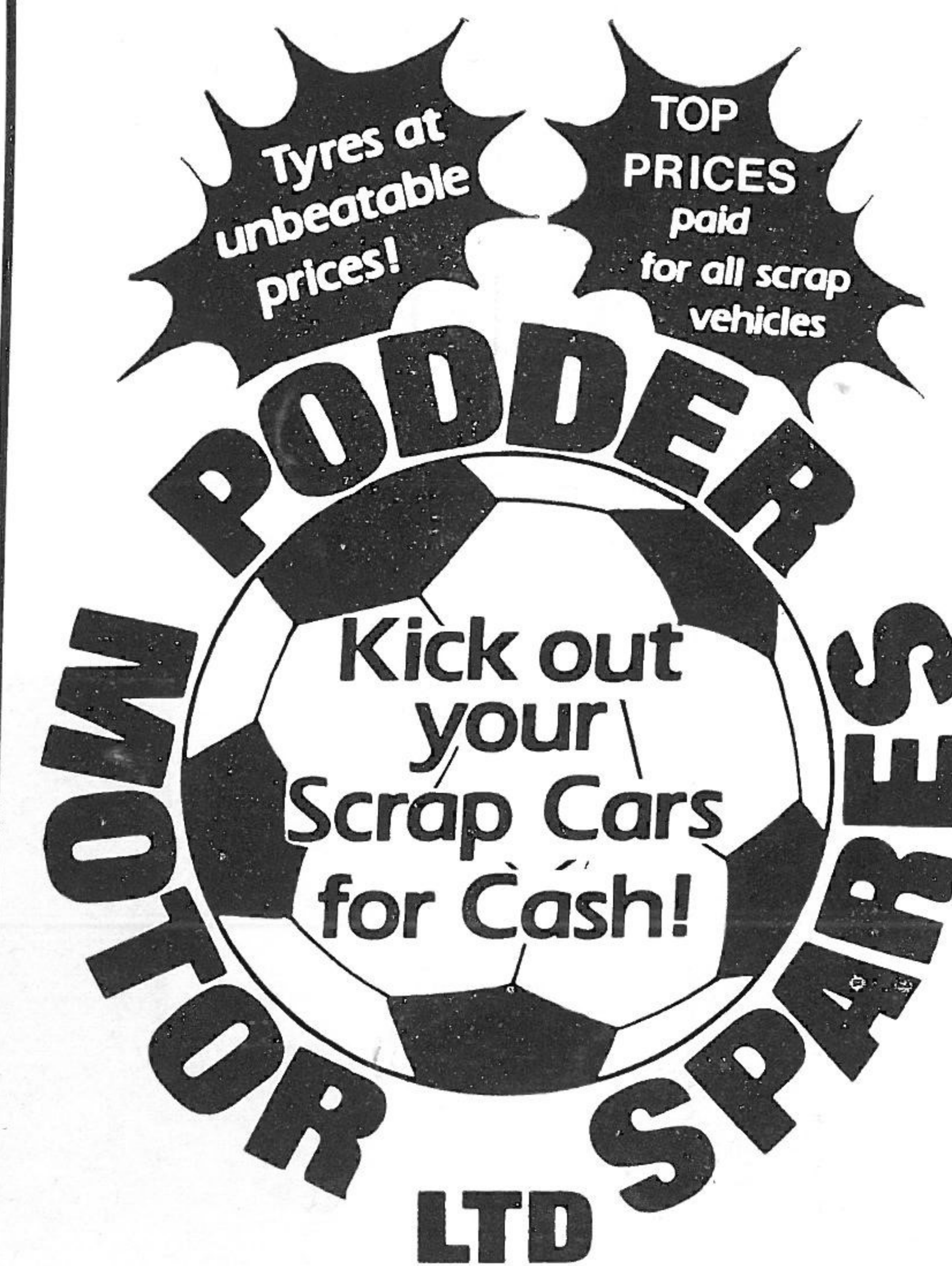
