

Aylott rounds off Luton's day

A SENDING-OFF, a penalty and a fine goal from Trevor Aylott at Kenilworth Road yesterday resulted in Luton's elevation to sixth place in the First Division.

Martin Jol was dismissed in the 67th minute for a foul on Luton's captain, Brian Horton, after having been cautioned with the game only seven minutes old—but before his departure Albion were already fighting a losing battle.

Cyrille Regis and Tony Morley, did nothing to convince England's manager, Bobby Robson, that they have any hope of a recall in the near future.

Regis, West Bromwich's leading scorer for the last three seasons, had an abysmal first appearance following an injury which has kept him out of the last eight games, and Morley did little better.

After 41 minutes Luke and Zondervan between them brought Daniel, Luton's young prospect, down in the box. Horton made a formality of beating Barron with the penalty.

Further chances

That marked the end of West Bromwich's challenge and, when Aylott converted Daniel's cross in the 64th minute, they had no hope of recovery.

Jol's dismissal, in the 67th minute, did anything but help Albion's cause and Luton — led supremely by Walsh — could have had further goals.
