But on Tuesday night Norwich were beaten 2-0 at Loftus Road by Queens Park Rangers, a result that narrowed the gap to just one goal-and the Town have two

They dropped one place on Saturday when Spurs overtook them with a 3-2 home win over Leicester.

Liverpool stayed clear at the top with a 2-1 win over Arsenal at Anfield, and Nottingham Forest held on to second place by winning 1-0 on the plastic pitch at Queens Park Rangers.

United needed to win at Kenilworth Road because West Ham had won 2-1 at Coventry on Saturday. That left the Hammers third until United's victory put them a point above West Ham.

It all adds up to the development of a "Super League" at the top of the table, with the leading four clubs now well clear of the hunch.

The consolation prize for the rest is the odd place or two in the UEFA Cup left
