Instead, in the words of manager Lawrie McMenemy, they "became a little sloppy near the end" and conceded a goal by Donaghy in the 90th minute.

During the five minutes added for injuries, Southampton showed clear signs of panic but Luton lacked the experience to exploit this unexpected situation steal an undeserved point.

Inexperience is a major prob-lem for Luton, "we desperately need to buy, not sell' emphasised David Pleat, their manager, who has read often this past week that Liverpool want to sign Walsh.
