

LUTON TOWN, under the shrewd leadership of manager David Pleat have done exceptionally well in 1983-84 after a last match win at Manchester City a season ago ensured them another term in the First Division.

After struggling for virtually all of last season the 'Hatters' from Kenilworth Road have played with gusto, confidence and above all, style during 1983-84, and although from time to time they have crashed alarmingly (0-5 at home to Manchester United and 0-6 at Anfield against Liverpool) their overall form, especially at home has been respected by the other clubs, and players, in the League.

Luton love to go forward in search of goals — this is why they let so many in at the 'wrong end' — but that's precisely how manager Pleat wants the game of Soccer to be played. He wants the fans, as well as his players, to enjoy football. Several managers, including Albion's Johnny Giles, have said outright that defensive soccer is ruining this great old English game — and David Pleat is one of these men.

You have got to score goals to win matches – that's simple. A team now-adays can complete a season unbeaten, drawing each and every game, and still get RELEGATED with 42 points!

So Luton Town will, and always will, as long as Pleat is in charge of team affairs, go out and play good stuff out on the park. He has the players capable of doing it in the best of company, and there is no doubt that Luton Town and their manager will be going out to capture three points this afternoon.

The players whom David Pleat will utilise against Albion will come from the following:

Goalkeeper Les Sealey, formerly of Coventry City who moved to Kenilworth Road prior to the start of this current

campaign. A Londoner from Bethnal Green, Les stands 6ft 1 in tall and made over 150 League appearances for the 'Sky Blues.'

Kirk Stephens, Mitchell Thomas and Mal Donaghy are the full-backs. Stephens, from Coventry is 29 years of age and recently passed 250 competitive appearances for Luton who secured him from Nuneaton Borough for a mere £5,000.

Thomas is a local lad who made his debut in the Number Three shirt against West Ham halfway through last season while Donaghy is an established

international for Northern Ireland. Mal is fast approaching 300 senior appearances for the 'Hatters' who obtained his services from Larne FC.

Paul Elliott, Clive Goodyear and Wayne Turner have all featured in defensive positions.

Elliot is likely to be missing from today's action, having been sent-off against Watford a fortnight ago. A former England Youth player he was signed from Charlton Athletic for £145,000 in March 1983. Goodyear is a six footer, 23 years old and comes from

Lincoln. He is on his way to playing 150 games for Town's 1st XI. And Turner, besides defending can also create from midfield and attack up front. He is another 23-year-old, a native of Luton, and a few seasons back was on loan to Lincoln City.

Brian Horton, the Club skipper, Ricky Hill and Gary Parker form the basis of Luton's midfield system.

Horton is an experienced competitor having assisted Port Vale (250 plus, outings) and Brighton (252 appearances) before linking up with Luton in a deal worth £100,000 in 1981. To date 35 years of age, Brian is still as keen and as energetic as ever and he is chasing 150 games for the 'Hatters.'

Hill has won two full caps for England. This 25-year-old Londoner is nearing 350 League and Cup outings for Luton whom he joined as a youngster back in 1976.

Parker is still only 18, and he made his League bow last season in the penultimate game of the campaign versus Manchester United at Old Trafford.

Striking for goals will be *Brian Stein* and *Paul Walsh*, both of whom represented England earlier this season, and outside-left *David Moss*, along with *Frankie Bunn*.

Stein is 26, originates from South Africa and has made around 250 appearances for Luton, scoring 100 goals. Walsh is 21, comes from Plumstead and cost £400,000 when signed from Charlton Athletic in the summer of '82. He



Moss, a fine penalty taker, has been plagued by injury this term but overall he has been a fine servant to Luton who captured him from non-Leaguers Witney Town. Before this 1983-84 season started David had hit over 80 goals in a total of 268 senior games for the Club.

Bunn, a Brummie, made his debut two seasons ago, but this term he has established himself in the side in the absence of Moss. He is 21, and looks to have a fine future ahead of him.

Raddy Antic, the Yugoslavian international, and Trevor Aylott are two more players who have served Luton proud this season, and last. Antic is 34 and has been 'Sub' more times than any other Luton player. He was signed from the Spanish club Zaragoza.

Aylott has served Chelsea, Barnsley, Millwall and Luton during his career which commenced ten years ago. To date he has played in some 240 major games for his four clubs and has scored 50 goals.



"Thommo' is Albion's leading scorer this season—and his next big milestone in the goalscoring stakes will be to top 100 in League and Cup competitions.

He netted 45 for Coventry City (38 in the League, seven in the F.A. Cup) before moving to The Hawthorns in February of last year. And now, after putting away a total of seven goals in just twelve League matches for Albion at the tail-end of that 1982-83 campaign, he has pushed his seasonal tally nearer to the 20 mark, which was a personal target before the start of 1983-84.

Garry has already bettered his previous top goals haul for a season—twelve in 1981/82 with the 'Sky Blues'—and if his efforts are anything to go by when he is out there on the park, then his total for this season is far from what it should be!

He goes on for ever. He runs, chases, harrasses and hustles his opponents throughout the entire 90 minutes of a match. And recently his determination and frustration got him sent-off at Molineux. But putting that aside, Garry is a 100% battler; a player who will never give up, even if his goal at the end of the tunnel is nigh-on impossible. He loves playing football—and he loves scoring goals.

If everything goes according to plan, there will be a few more to register in the name of Garry Thompson (Albion) in the very near future.






A crowd of 21,861 saw Albion win a thriller by 4-3, their goals coming from Don Howe (4 minutes), Derek Kevan (23), Tony Forrester (40) and Ronnie Allen, penalty (83). Albion led 3-0 at half-time. The following week Albion drew 1-1 away to Nottingham Forest and on 13th December they crushed Chelsea 4-0 at home when Forrester on this occasion scored twice.

The first of these games was played at The Hawthorns on 27th August, 1938, when Albion won a Second Division fixture 3-0, in front of 24,377 fans. Harry Jones (2) and Meynell Burgin scored the goals.

The return at Kenilworth Road-on Christmas Eve-went Luton's way 3-1.

After the war Luton did the 'double' over Albion in 1946-47. winning 2-0 at home and 2-1 away, then two years later, when Albion won promotion to the First Division, they did the 'double' over Luton, winning 2-1 at The Hawthorns and 1-0 at Kenilworth Road.

The initial Division One clash between the teams took place at Luton in September 1955-and Albion won 2-0 with a Ronnie Allen penalty and a second from Frank Griffin. The gate topped 24,400.

Later that season Albion won 3-1 at home with Stuart Williams. George Lee and Frank Griffin the marksmen before a crowd of

In successive seasons of 1956-57 and 1957-58 Albion won both their home games against Luton by the same scoreline of 4-0, and Luton belted Albion 5-1 at Kenilworth Road in December 1957.

Another 4-0 Albion win arrived at The Hawthorns in October 1959 when 22,445 saw Ronie Allen (2), Brian Whitehouse and Derek Kevan hit the net.

There were no encounters at all between 1960 and 1973 and since then (1973-74), out of the seven League games played, Albion have registered three wins, Luton two and two games have ended level.

Albion have in fact beaten Luton by 1-0 on the last two occasions the teams have met at The Hawthorns-in October 1982 when Clive Whitehead's effort won the points, and in August 1975 when a goal by John Trewick separated the sides. In this game Albion were aided by a certain Johnny Giles!




