

## WEST BROMWICH ALBION



Albion could probably lay claim to the title of the First Division's yo-yo side over the first half of the season. The men from the Hawthorns have zoomed up and down the table, beating sides above them yet dropping points to teams they might have expected to have done well against.

It has been a curious three and a half months for manager Johnny Giles with the only consistent point about West Bromwich's form being their inconsistency!

It started on the opening day of the campaign when Albion went down 3-1 to Queens Park Rangers at Loftus Road. Yet two days later they beat Everton 2-1 at the Hawthorns and then put four goals past Town to be third in the table when the first League placings of the season were published.

But then followed three successive draws and defeats at Leicester and at home to Manchester United so that by the end of September, Albion were only two points clear of the bottom three.

More recently however, there have been signs of another revival. A 5-2 win against Coventry at the end of last month was followed by a useful 2-0 win at West Ham when the team at last began to play with the fluency Giles has demanded.

The Irishman who returned to the Hawthorns for his second spell as manager last February has an impressive management team alongside him in Nobby Stiles and Norman Hunter and his three main signings since the season started brought tried and trusted players to the Hawthorns who had played with and against Giles in Canada.

Striker David Cross and winger Carl Valentine were members of the Vancouver Whitecaps side Giles managed in North America while Irish full-back Jimmy Nicholl had played in the NASL for Toronto.

Like his manager, Cross is back for a second stint at West Bromwich and he quickly made his experience felt at the Hawthorns, so much so that Albion were able to release England striker Cyrille Regis to Coventry City.

Valentine, after early injury problems, has begun to settle down in the First Division, his previous League experience being with Oldham Athletic, while Nicholl learned his trade at Manchester United and had a spell on loan with Glasgow Rangers last season.


Apart from this trio of newcomers, Albion are pretty well as they were last season although Tony Godden who played 12 League games for Luton on loan here two seasons ago, has reclaimed the number one position from

ex-Crystal Palace 'keeper Paul Barron.

Derek Statham partners Nicholl at full-back with Martyn Bennett and Alistair Robertson in the centre of the defence and a midfield usually made up of Steve Hunt, capped twice by England last season, Eire cap Tony Grealish and Steve MacKenzie, and England Under-21 cap who is now beginning to fulfil the promise he showed in his early career at Manchester City.

With Valentine operating in a wide position, the main strike force comprises of Cross and Gary Thompson, the side's top scorer this season with 14 goals in League and Milk Cup games up to the start of this month.

Nicky Cross has worn the number 12 shirt fairly regularly in recent weeks and it's a sign of the strength of Albion's squad that there has been no room for experienced names like centre-half Ken McNaught, former England winger Tony Morley and striker Peter Eastoe. Morley and Eastoe have both spent spells away from the Hawthorns on loan, Morley rejoining his former Aston Villa boss Ron Saunders at Birmingham and Eastoe after a spell with Walsall, at Leicester where he also had a stint last season.

In the last few years Albion have tended to look like a side more capable of doing well in the Cup than putting in a sustained challenge for League honours and they fancied their chances of a lengthy Milk Cup run this season after putting out Wigan and then near neighbours Birmingham.

Their Wembley hopes ended with a heavy defeat at Watford in the fourth round though and one of Giles' major tasks at the Hawthorns is to find a consistent streak that will sustain a challenge for a European place over the second half of the season. For all your Floral arrangements contact:

A huge road map of Britain dominates the wall of Ron Howard's office at Kenilworth Road. And it shows Luton as its focal point, with routes and mileages neatly marked off to all four corners of the country.

For 54-year-old football fanatic Ron spends more than half his working life on the road, going to and from all sorts of games in the never-ending search for talent.

And the chief scout whose work is vital for the future of Luton Town FC hardly ever sees the team he supports. While the Hatters' squad is preparing for another First Division challenge, Ron will be anything up to 200 miles away, getting ready to watch players you have never heard of.

Ron's club Cavalier clocks around 40,000 miles a year taking him on his duties as chief scout. And it's a lonely life, because after years in the business he has come to the conclusion that the job needs 100 per cent concentration and single-mindedness.

'It gets a little lonely at times. But I have never ceased to be grateful for the way life has worked out for me,' he said. 'I can hardly believe how lucky I am to be earning a living in football.'

His love of soccer led to him being a fair player in senior amateur football, but a knee injury ended his playing days in his early twenties, and he took up coaching and refereeing

A Londoner, he was born to be a QPR supporter, and gradually he became involved with Rangers. Gratefully he threw in his lot with Rangers when they offered him a fulltime scouting job, and he has been weighing up players ever since.

He worked for seven managers at Rangers, including Tommy Docherty, Alec Stock and Dave Sexton. Then moved to Cambridge where six years of hard work included the formation of a Youth policy to bolster Cambridge's assets.

David Pleat persuaded Ron to come to Luton last summer, and the happy miles have rolled by just about every day since.

Like a lot of men in football he admits that he is blessed by an understanding wife. He married Joan 32 years ago, and they cheerfully cope with the strains that football puts on the marriages of those who get wrapped up in the game.

'Quite often I leave home in the morning without knowing where I'll be 12 hours later,' said Ron. 'You have to be married to a wife who expects the unbelievable and impossible to happen every day.'

He has lost track of the number of grounds he has visited on trips that are a mixture of business and pleasure. 'They joke about spending a wet night in Scunthorpe, but you have plenty of those. You can be sent to sit in comfort at Old Trafford one day, and then stand on a rainy windswept terrace on a non-League ground the next.'

Ask Ron to describe a typical week, and he admits he doesn't know where to start, because during the season there's no such thing as the end of a week for him.

Last Monday, for instance, Ron drove to Kenilworth Road from his home at Hatch End to be behind a mound of paperwork on his desk at 9.30. After a discussion with David Pleat about teams and players he had watched on Saturday and Sunday they decided on the game he should watch that night. It was 180 miles away, with a contact's tip-off to be followed up about a



player who might just be an exciting pro-

Three hours of driving took Ron to the ground, and after watching the game — carefully sitting on his own so that no friend could upset his concentration — Ron got back into the Cavalier for another three-hour ride home. He was back at Hatch End at about 1.30 am — and the player who was the target will probably have to be watched three or four more times before any realistic judgement can be made.

'That's an average sort of day for me,' said Ron. 'I did something similar — different ground, different player — on Tuesday and again on Wednesday.

'On Thursday I try to do a bit of paperwork, and then I'm involved with the club's schools of excellence with young players.' Saturday's itinery takes in a schools or youth game in the morning, and another match in the afternoon. Sometimes it will be to a First Division ground, to prepare an assessment for David Pleat on opponents the Hatters are due to meet. Sometimes it will be to a local parks pitch, or to a Third or Fourth Division club.

'The only time I have seen our first team in action this season was when we played at Nottingham Forest on a Sunday. I enjoyed that — most Sundays I'm busy watching at least two games.

'The real time we do our business in scouting is over the tea and biscuits at half-time.'

And the time the scouts do their hard thinking is during the long lonely hours on the motorways of Britain.






He didn't make the first team at Hillsborough and when Peterborough United offered him terms in May
