

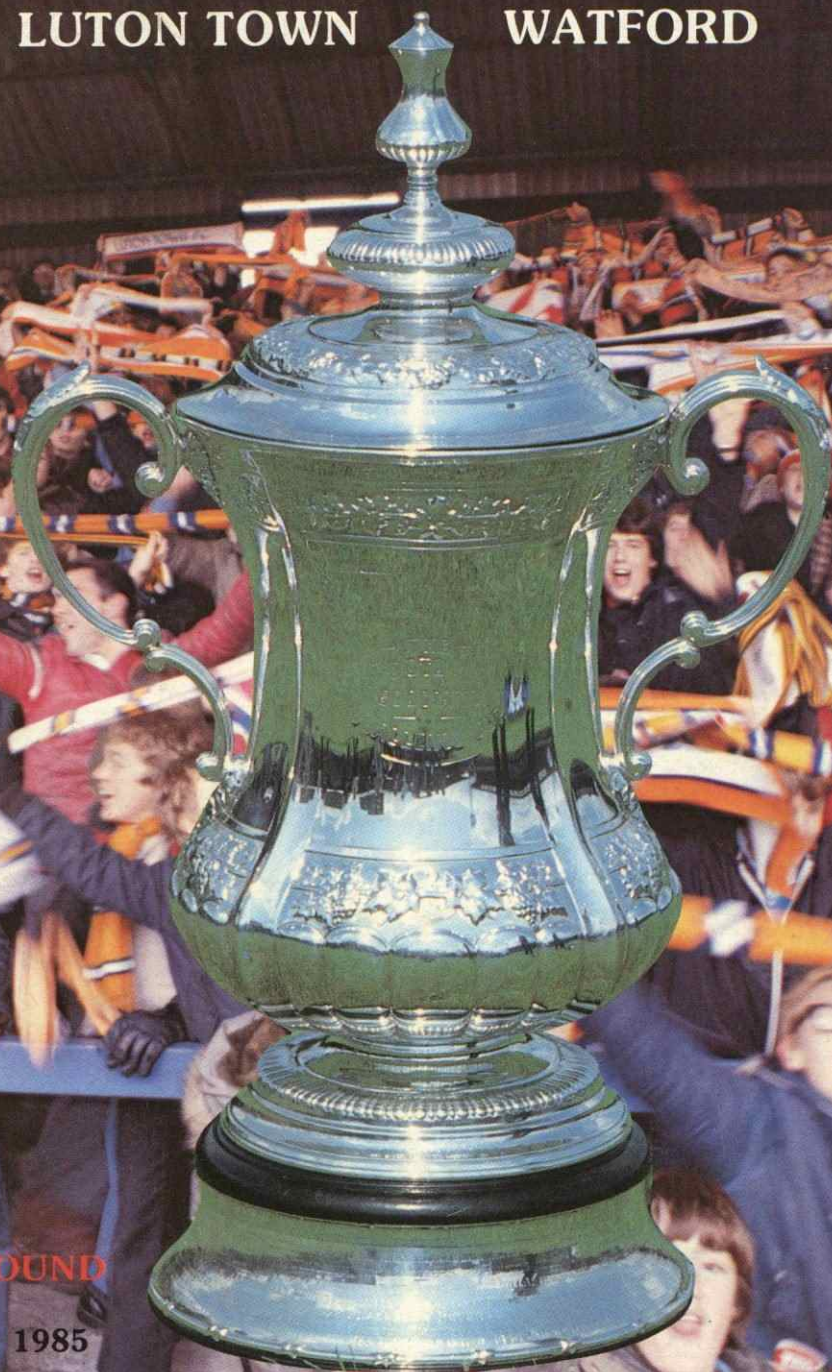

Luton's Gary Parker moved forward to assist Frank Bunn who graced the score sheet twice in our 3-2 win.

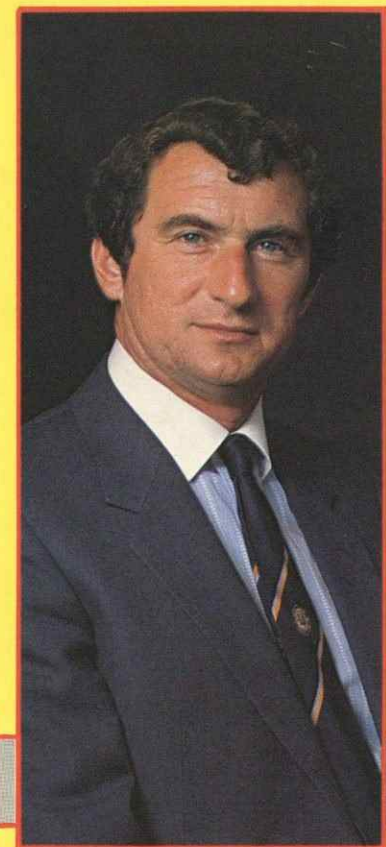
Welcome to Kenilworth Road where I hope you will enjoy a Cup-tie that will be equally as entertaining as last season's contest between the two teams. Our visitors have made exceptional progress during the last few seasons and I am quite sure that if they can improve their gates further they have the organisation to creep into the top six clubs in the country. Although I know our clubs gave a history of strong local rivalry I think it is important that no one allows themselves to get carried away by emotion. It is my sincere hope that after 90 minutes tonight we not only can say that the players provided good value for money but also the spectators encouraged their teams with pride as well as behaving beyond reproach.

The sudden change of weather really has thrown a spanner into the works as clubs have prepared for important Cup-ties. Our game at Southampton would have proved farcical as the pitch would have become a bog — it rained on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday and started raining on Friday followed by the snow which carpeted the pitch to a depth of four inches. It was one of those days when the weather won hands down. We planned a quick about turn and a look at West Ham in Hertfordshire but the weather even beat the groundstaff there. I can assure all our supporters that shopping at Sainsburys on a Saturday afternoon is more boring than the worst possible no score draw!

Ray Daniel had played outstandingly well in his appearances recently giving us added thrust down the left flank. In the end I opted for David Preece to play in that role but David is more than aware of the competition. Likewise Wayne Turner had been one of our best players at Stoke in the third round replay and with Ricky Hill won the midfield honours against Huddersfield. Peter Nicholas signing just increases the competition but the team will always be selected on merit and Wayne will be pushing hard for a regular place.

The overall performance against Spurs needs maintaining. Nothing is easy in the First Division. A game is never won until its lost and its that 'stickability' that we shall require over the coming games. Too many people say to me 'you're too good to go down' I say rubbish. We have to earn the right to stay in Division One and that is going to require exceptional results — probably nine wins out of 18 games. We have no illusions about our position. But hard graft and team spirit will do it.

I would like to make a point about the over publicised ground affair. The media are loving it and some people maybe bored with it but without action we will not survive at Kenilworth Road unless massive changes are made. The ring road and railway line adjustment crucifies us and the Council sits and waits. Our chairman has bought the controversy to a head by his bold approach and

FA CUP SCENE



York City's win over Arsenal in the fourth round of the competition must surely rate as one of the biggest upsets in recent years. The goal scorer Keith Houchen was being hailed as the Grand Young Duke of York after the game which saw him beat John Lukic from the penalty spot with only 30 seconds of normal time left to play.

Ironically that was only the second penalty that he had ever taken for York and he missed the other one. Manager Dennis Smith said 'This is the greatest day in the history of this club. I mean beating Arsenal what can be better than that.' He went on to say 'I demanded passion and commitment and I got it.' City's efforts rewarded them with a home tie against the mighty Liverpool in the fifth round and from the start of the game they went at the reds and at half-time it looked as if there was going to be another Cup upset.

Early in the second-half Ian Rush escaped his marker and with a deft turn hit a shot home beyond the home goalkeeper. However York kept plugging away and Sbragia equalised with only six minutes of the game remaining. Things were quite difficult in the replay at Anfield as Liverpool struck seven times without reply. Manager Dennis Smith summed it up after the match. 'It was embarrassing wasn't it,' 'They bring on their substitute and its Paul Walsh of England while our Martin Butler comes from the Youth Opportunity Scheme.

Wimbledon come next. After an exciting match at the City ground which produced a blank score sheet manager Dave Bassett was smiling and said 'That now makes five clashes that I have had with Brian Clough, twice as a player and three times as a manager and he hasn't beaten me yet. In the replay at Plough Lane he had more

reason to smile as a Paul Fishendon goal gave the Dons a passage into the fifth round and another home tie with fellow Londoners West Ham United.

This game is scheduled for tonight. Darlington became the fifth club in recent years to fall to Telford United in the competition. This time they won handsomely by three goals to nil. Their reward was a trip to Goodison Park to take on the First Division leaders and Cup favourites Everton and they certainly let the Toffee men know they were there. Although they lost the match by 3-0 they battled for every ball and they felt the wrath of the home supporters for their tough but fair tackles. Peter Reid, Kevin Sheedy and Trevor Steven scored the goals that sunk Telford, but they took home nearly £60,000 for the afternoon's work which should make their bank manager happy.

Goals from Mal Donaghy and Brian Stein booked Luton Town a home tie with neighbours Watford. It wasn't until the 33rd minute in the match against Huddersfield that Luton took control when visitors full-back Brian Laws was sent off for his second bookable offence. After that Huddersfield were never allowed to settle and failed to produce the flowing football that they can play.

With Sheffield Wednesday having such a good season you might expect manager Howard Wilkinson to be full of excitement but when asked if his team would get to Wembley this year he replied 'Of course we can — so can anyone else.' Oldham Athletic held up for only 17 minutes before wilting under the constant Wednesday pressure and by the end Imre Varadi had scored a hat-trick and Lee Chapman and Brian Marwood had also got on to the score sheet. John Bowden's reply for Oldham was only a fleeting

setback. In the next round they face Ipswich Town at Portman Road. This match like a few others is still a victim of the bad weather at the time these notes were written.

Chelsea went to Wigan and must have enjoyed the Northern air as they rattled in five goals without reply. Kerry Dixon claimed four of the goals including one from the spot. Wigan manager Harry McNally was quoted after the match as saying 'If Mark Hateley is worth a million pounds on the transfer market then Dixon is priceless. He is the best centre-forward in Britain by a mile. Only a few days later Millwall visited Stamford Bridge to play the outstanding fourth round tie and really brought the Londoners down to earth by beating them three goals to two. The Lions manager George Graham was over the moon with his team's performance and said 'This is the best result that the team had achieved since I took over the managers job. I was on the winning side here many times as a player but this is the best.' In the fifth round they entertained Leicester City at the Den and in front of 16,160 fans they showed all the enthusiasm and grit that destroyed Chelsea. Their goal heroes on the night were John Fashanu, younger brother of the famous Justin, and 20-year-old Alan McLeary who was only drafted into the side in place of suspended skipper Les Briley. At the end of the match hundreds of dock-side fans invaded the pitch in an old fashioned knees up. Manager George Graham said after the match 'We are now only two matches away from Wembley and if you say it quickly it doesn't seem too difficult.' Their opponents in the next round Luton or Watford might have something to say about that.

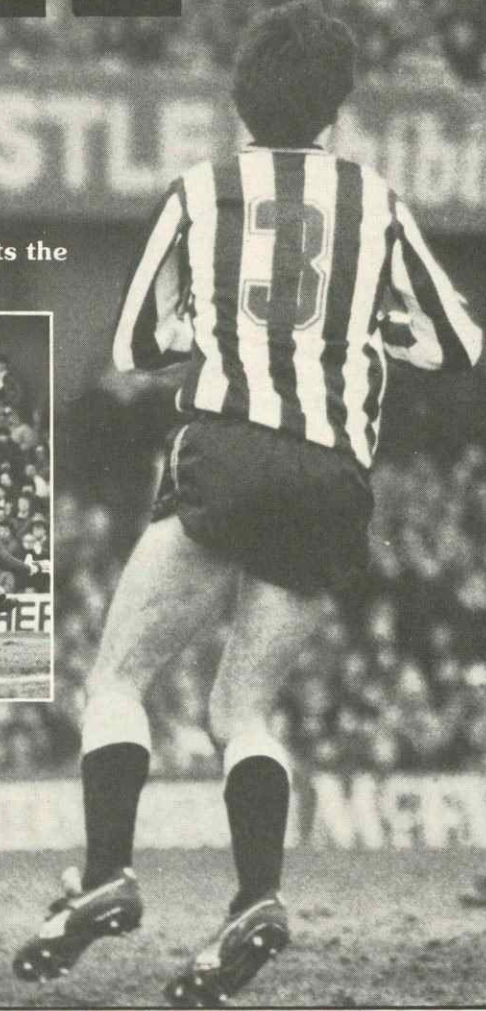

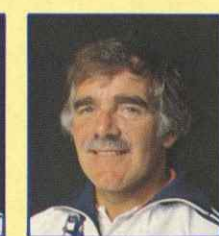

Graham Taylor brings his side the short distance up the motorway this afternoon to the scene where last season's run to Wembley started. Back in the third round of last season's competition, Watford drew 2-2 here at Kenilworth Road in the third round before winning a titanic replay 4-3 and launching a Cup run that ultimately led to Wembley and defeat by Everton last May.

Watford enjoyed their first-ever visit to Wembley, despite losing out to Everton and there's a feeling at Vicarage Road that the Twin Towers are beckoning again.

When the Hornets were here for a League game in October, they were struggling near the foot of the table. But since then they have climbed clear of trouble, reached the quarter-finals of the Milk Cup and overcome a potentially difficult fourth round FA Cup-tie at Second Division Grimsby, coming back after conceding an early goal to win in convincing style.

Watford's early season problems were mainly defensive ones. Although they maintained a useful scoring record, coming up with three or more goals in half their first 14 matches, they struggled at the other end, letting in almost as many. At one stage Watford were not only the First Division's top scorers . . . they also had the worst defensive record.

Manager Taylor made two significant signings to stop the flow of goals. First he paid out £300,000 for Birmingham City goalkeeper Tony Coton and then he bolstered the centre of his back four by paying a £200,000 plus fee for Glasgow Rangers' Irish defender John McClelland.

McClelland holds a fairly unique record, having played for clubs in each of the four home countries and his return to the English game had the desired effect on the Watford defensive set-up. McClelland figured on the winning side in each of his first five League and Cup games.

'What appealed to me is that John has had to fight to get where he is. He has a lot of ability and has never lost sight of how he has progressed,' said Taylor about the man who has played for Portadown and Bangor in Northern Ireland, Cardiff City, Mansfield and Rangers.

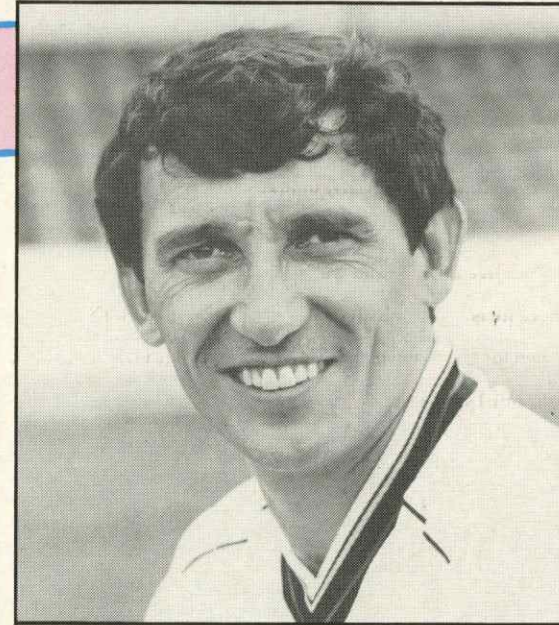
Watford's progress in the Cup so far has had much to do with the striking power of Luther Blissett, back with the Hornets this season after a frustrating season in Italy with AC Milan.

Blissett needed time to settle in back at Vicarage Road but in the third round he scored four times in a 5-0 win against Sheffield United and at Grimsby three weeks ago, he was twice on target as Watford showed their class against the Second Division team.

That took Blissett's goals total for the season to 17 and his scoring form has more than offset the loss of Mo Johnston, who returned to Scotland with Celtic four months ago.

There has been a more settled look about the Watford side in recent weeks with McClelland partnering Steve Terry at the centre of the defence and ex-Walsall man Lee Sinnott switching to right-back to partner Wilf Rostron.

Les Taylor, who has been a useful signing since leaving Oxford four years ago, plays in midfield alongside Welsh international Kenny Jackett with England Under-21 winger

Nigel Callaghan on the right and the lively John Barnes on the left-hand side.

Barnes, now a permanent fixture in Bobby Robson's England side, has won 15 full caps and although he had a disappointing game in last season's Final, he showed his quality with that superb goal for England in Brazil last summer.

Callaghan has faced competition in recent weeks from 19-year-old Worrell Sterling and there was a place in Watford's line-up at Grimsby in the last round for another youngster Jimmy Gilligan, who wore George Reilly's number nine shirt and scored in the Hornets' Blundell Park fight back.

Reilly, the big Scot whose semi-final goal against Plymouth at Villa Park last April, booked Watford's Wembley place has been the target for a number of clubs this season, including Newcastle. So far though, Watford have resisted bids and the former Northampton Town and Cambridge striker has formed a useful understanding with Blissett.

One other name who could figure in Watford's plans this afternoon is midfield player Richard Jobson, who Watford signed from the non-League ranks. He played in the side beaten 3-2 in the League game at Kenilworth Road in October and scored an own goal in Town's win.

Up to a few weeks ago, Watford had double hopes of returning to Wembley but they bowed out of the Milk Cup beaten 1-0 at home by Sunderland on an icy Vicarage Road surface.

That defeat has probably made Graham Taylor's men even more determined to match last season's FA Cup exploits.

So everything looks set for a classic Cup confrontation this afternoon with Watford no doubt hoping that history will repeat itself and, like last season, Kenilworth Road will be a stopping off point on the route to Wembley in May.

- 4 A last minute opportunity falls to Mal Donaghy after continual Town pressure but unfortunately Mal's shot just goes over the bar.



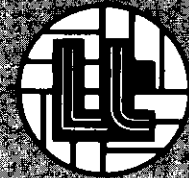

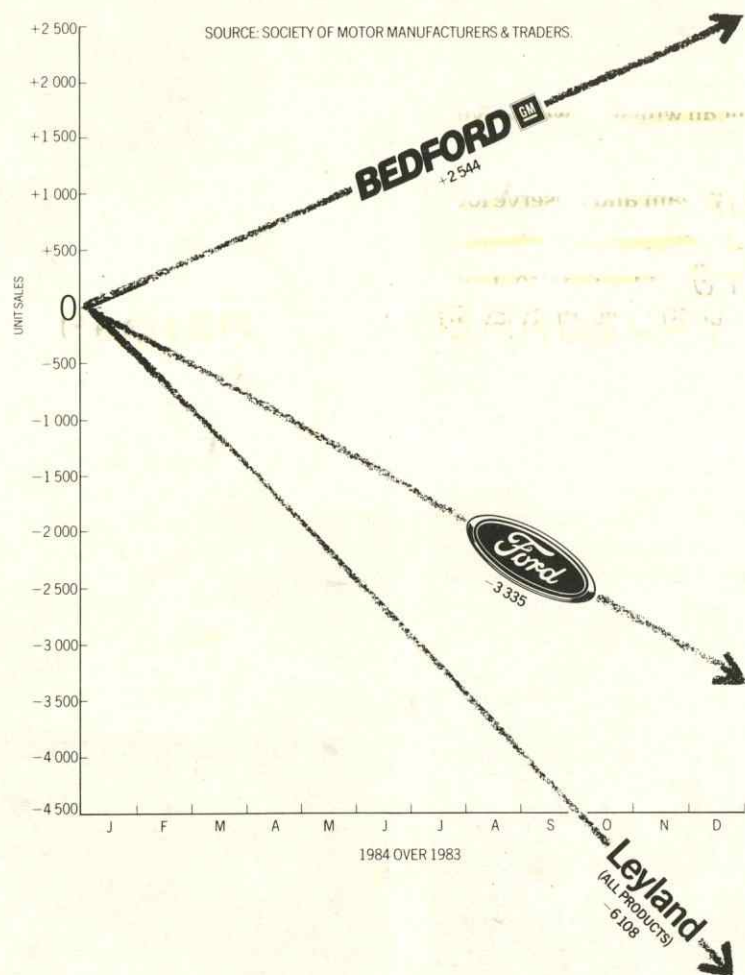

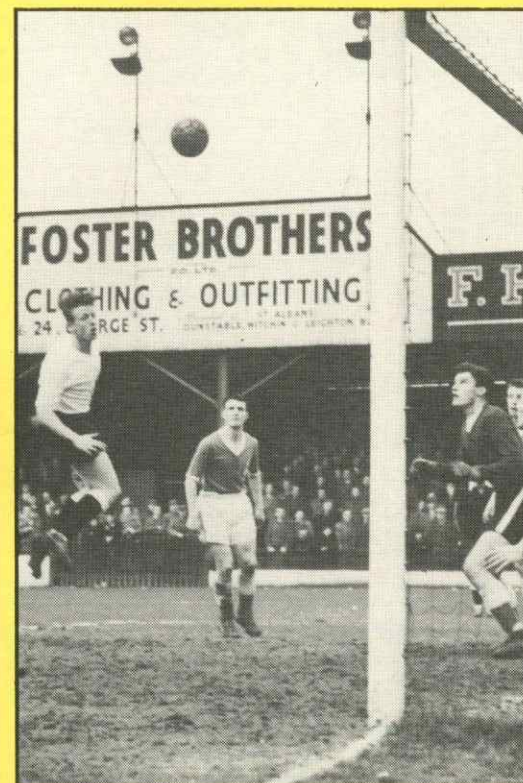
