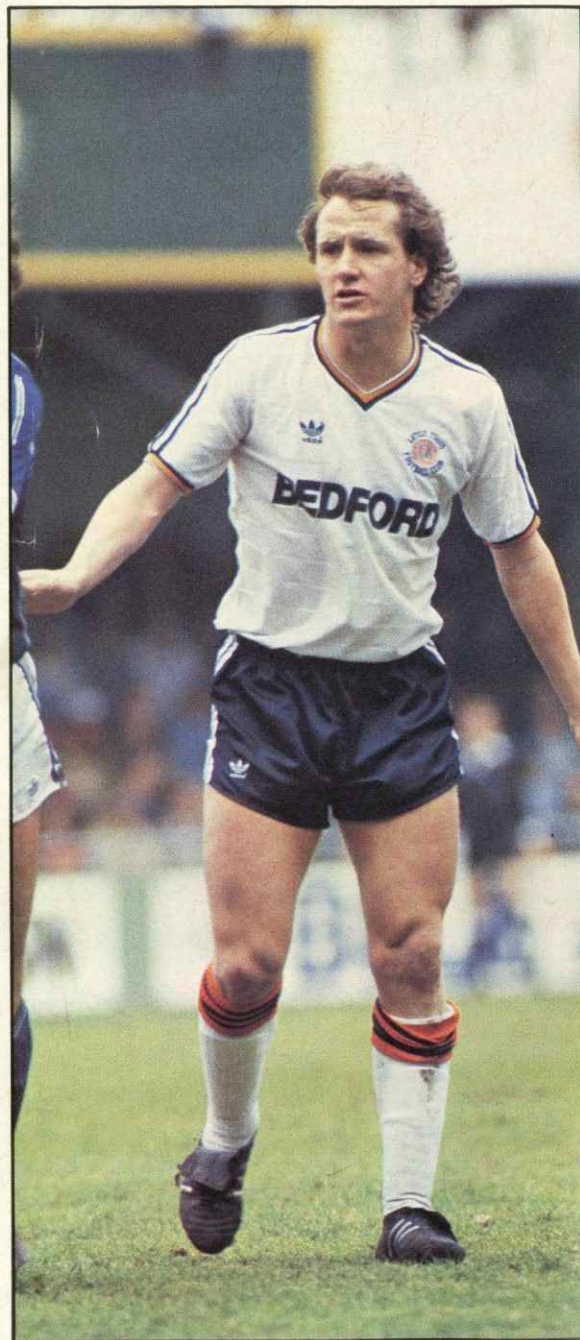
# LUTON STARS AIM FOR MEXICO

# CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE

Season 1984-85 is now coming to a close and what an extra ordinary season it has been. We certainly did not expect last August 1984 the disappointment, turmoil, relief and elation we would all feel. However I do not want to dwell too long on the past except to say that once we were able to strengthen the team, our record was better than most and culminated by reaching the FA Cup semi-final and in the end comfortably avoiding relegation. Whilst we cannot anticipate what will take place in the close season I am confident we have and will continue to have a pool of players on which we can be proud and continue to build for our future.

The future is of course what we are all interested in. I therefore propose to dwell on this rather than the past.

You will know that I am continuing to keep all our supporters informed and this has been well received by you all. This will continue to be our practice and I would welcome any thoughts or ideas you have.

What remains a continuing blight and constraint on the club is the relief road. When I publicly attacked the Bedfordshire County Council at the end of last year and when it looked as if we would relocate to Milton Keynes, the Council went to great pains to inform the public of what they were doing for us. Suddenly it's all gone quiet again. After five years you would have thought they could have got their act together. But no, it still drags on, sapping both our energies and badly needed resources. The County Council have progressively accepted our argument despite claims of exaggeration. The tragedy of Bradford underlines once again what the club has been saying about safety once the relief road is built the Main Stand which is part timber construction becomes vulnerable. Safety of course must be paramount and we have therefore written to the County Council seeking assurances from them. However what is still true today is that the club cannot remain viable at Kenilworth Road and therefore an alternative must be found.

**CANNOT THE COUNTY COUNCIL, BOROUGH COUNCIL AND ALL OTHER INTERESTED PARTIES GET TOGETHER TO HAVE ONE LAST TRY TO SEE WHETHER THERE IS A SITE IN LUTON WHERE A STADIUM CAN BE CREATED TO ENSURE THAT IT IS SAFE FROM DISASTERS SUCH AS IBROX AND BRADFORD. THIS IS THE WAY FORWARD.**

In the meantime we have to live at Kenilworth Road. We have to reduce our losses and bring the fabric of the ground to a minimum acceptable standard. Whilst many will see this as pouring good money after bad, nevertheless we have to continue to live and if this means providing facilities which although commit large sums of money for capital expenditure provide an immediate injection of income we shall do so. Although this does not alter the underlying fact about viability and safety at Kenilworth Road.

We are installing an En-Tout-Cas Spor-

turf professional porous synthetic football pitch in time for next season. We are hopeful that this will produce an excellent surface for football plus additional commercial and community benefits. Luton pioneered the introduction of this surface through the inception of the 'Walter Winterbottom report on natural grass surfaces.'

We also hope to improve the general appearance of the ground including some of the facilities. Examination is taking place on other self-financing projects for season 1986-87.

I hope you have been encouraged by what we are trying to achieve. We shall need your help and assistance in our relocation initiative — (watch this space) — we shall continue to keep you informed. In return we ask you to support all of our various activities, support the need for increased income through for example increased admission prices, support attendances by bringing a friend and support the spirit of the club through proper behaviour. Respect the elderly, the children the visitors and above all have pride.

Finally, may I thank you the fans and everyone connected with the club for all the support you have given me since becoming Chairman. It has been a great encouragement for us to go forward, and we will.

I look forward to receiving your support next season, an historic one, our Centenary season we hope you will enjoy what I think will be something special and exciting. There are still some surprises to come!

My personal congratulations to Chairman Philip Carter and all connected with Everton. Yours has been a marvellous example to us all, a tremendous achievement.

See you all next season.

Not content with winning the League they have also won the European Cup Winners' Cup and were beaten by the only goal in the Wembley FA Cup Final.

Their near neighbours Liverpool haven't done too badly either — after a very shaky start. At the time of writing, they were still to play Juventus in the European Cup in Belgium and their improved form during the second half of the season enabled them to pip Tottenham for the runners-up spot. Manchester United of course, won the FA Cup and finished fourth in the table, Chelsea were sixth and Nottingham Forest ninth. So, all in all, the forecast was not bad.

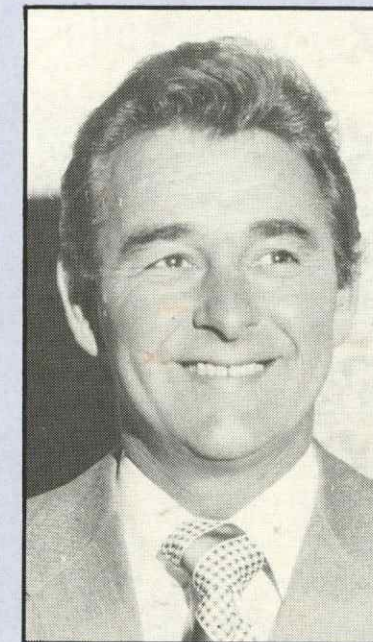
Portsmouth's Neil Webb has decided to join Nottingham Forest. Webb looked all set to sign for Aston Villa after talks, but on the eve of a final get together with Graham Turner, he telephoned the Villa manager to say he had chang-

ed his mind and decided to join Brian Clough at Nottingham. The clubs have still to agree a transfer fee. If they fail to do so, it will be settled by an independent tribunal.

West Bromwich Albion have offered reserve defender Barry Cowdrill a new contract after deciding that they cannot afford to keep England defender Derek Statham. Manager

John Giles is offering Cowdrill, who has been available for transfer for two years, the chance of becoming Albion's first choice left-back. Statham, Albion's highest paid player was transfer listed after failing to negotiate an improved contract.

Tottenham striker Garth Crooks may not be leaving White Hart Lane after all. Manager Peter Shreeves revealed recently Crooks had turned down a new one year contract, but the man who broke the London club's seventy-four-year-old winless record at Liverpool earlier in the season, admits he is now prepared to renegotiate. Crooks is believed to have had offers from West Bromwich Albion, Manchester City, Sunderland and two European clubs.

# RESERVES + YOUTHS

A poor end of season run during which we scored only six goals in the final six games in the Football Combination unfortunately spoiled an otherwise excellent term for the reserves. A final finishing position in the top seven is a more than satisfactory return on the season, however, but it must be noted that if the early season rush of goals had continued throughout we would surely have been runaway champions. In the first seven games we cracked 27 goals and looked like breaking all records . . . and in the end we finished with a grand total of 97 goals in 42 games. Mark Stein topped the scoring lists with 22 goals in 40 appearances and Emeka Nwajiobi, who of course broke into the first team during the season, added 20 in 13 appearances. The final analysis must be that the club is in excellent shape with so many young players, including several schoolboys, turning out and performing so well throughout the season which has produced plenty of entertainment.



A first ever triumph in the South East Counties League championship has made 1984-85 a magnificent season for the youth team, which has competed in the Under-17 section with a squad of players most of whom are under 16. The 13-1 victory at Oxford during March was the highlight of the season and was a performance of genuine class which captivated all who were present. Since then, form has been less consistent within

the team as several players deservedly earned appearances with the reserves. It is a measure of the quality of the players and the success of the team that a total of ten apprentices are expected to be taken on for next season.

'that football isn't life and death, it's more important' is valid. Winning football often stems from enjoying the type of football you play. If a manager is constantly under pressure his ideas get twisted.

We all congratulate Everton on everything they have achieved. Theirs has been a truly remarkable recommendation for every player involved and Howard Kendall and his staff. I have said in retrospect much as though we would all have loved to have been walking out at Wembley the worry of that defeat has not been lost. We worked harder to succeed in our goal.

We now face an even more hectic summer. With freedom of contract one can never be sure in May who will be with you come August. Players move for various reasons those who move entirely for monetary reasons don't always gain greater success. Eighteen months ago Everton had no full internationals playing in their team at that time — now there are 10. They are as good as individuals as the side they have been

shaped into. We hope that our players who have the option to seek fresh pastures consider the football side of their careers because we have a future at Luton which could be an exciting proposition which will project their careers further.

One of the major changes will be playing on a synthetic surface. With our crowd capacity we need to be able to finance First Division football without reducing our chances of being successful as a team. I am satisfied that we have the players who can pass accurately and a good flat surface is something that we can enjoy. All our supporters can rest assured that our style of play will not change and that the surface will be suited 100 per cent to the criteria of what is required for a top class pitch.

The summer will be more than busy before we re-group around 15th July. The Youth team have just been to Holland. Players are involved with internationals, new apprentices will be joining us, training schedules including a pre-season trip to Sweden will be finalis-

ed and of course contracts have to be agreed.

I am confident that we can look forward progressively. It will be important that our supporters buy the season tickets and help us gain some revenue to support the speculations of this season. It has been an enjoyable end and I would close by wishing all our good supporters a happy summer and promise you that under Mr Evans and our Board we will continue to move forward in order to satisfy our ambitions.

Enjoy the game.

## EVERTON



Canon League Champions . . . European Cup-Winners' Cup Winners . . . FA Cup Finalists . . . that's the impressive record Everton bring to Kenilworth Road to round off our season this evening.

Norman Whiteside's goal at Wembley 10 days ago deprived the Goodison Park club of a unique treble but few would dispute Everton's claims to be English football's team of the season.

With two major prizes resting in the Goodison Park trophy cupboard the club has also picked up a stack of individual honours in recent weeks . . . goalkeeper Neville Southall, the Football Writers' Player of the Year, Peter Reid, the PFA's Player of the Season and manager Howard Kendall, odds on favourite to have won the Bell's Manager of the Year award last weekend.

It's an impressive list, leaving aside Everton's disappointment at Wembley. And the club's success in the past nine months has been further recognised by the selection of Reid, Gary Stevens, Trevor Steven and Paul Bracewell for England's trip to Mexico while strikers Andy Gray and Graeme Sharp are in the Scotland squad for the World Cup game with Iceland this week.

In fact, of the 11 on duty at Wembley against Manchester

United, only central defender Derek Mountfield has not been selected for international duty this season, despite the fact that the England Under-21 man has had a fine season with 14 goals underlining his value to the Goodison squad.

Yet 18 months ago it was a different story at Goodison Park. A bad run of results and falling crowds plus Liverpool's continuing success just across Stanley Park created a crisis of confidence for Kendall and his coaching staff.

Everton's answer was a dramatic improvement in League results, a run to the Milk Cup Final and last May, success at Wembley against Watford in the FA Cup.

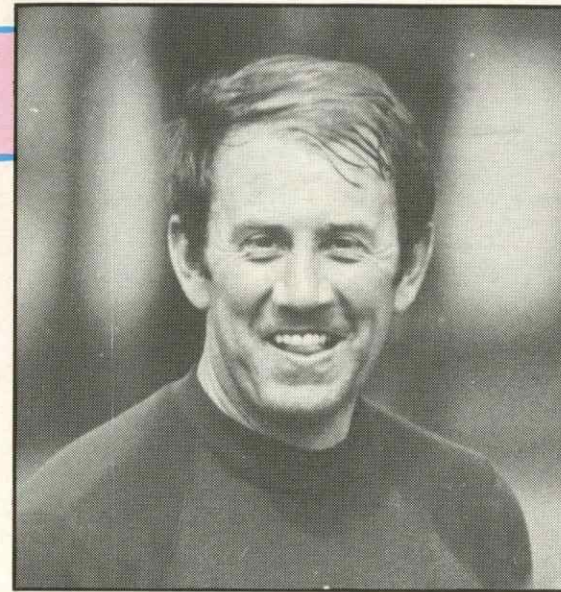
Although beaten at home in their first League game this season by Tottenham, Everton struck a rich vein of form and since the New Year they've run away with the League title, a 28 match unbeaten run ending at Nottingham Forest earlier this month, a few days after they had clinched the title for the first time in 15 years by beating Queens Park Rangers.

Apart from that Cup Final defeat by Manchester United, Everton's only other blemish this season was in losing to a last minute goal against Grimsby in an early round of the Milk Cup.

Ironically, the scorer of that goal, Paul Wilkinson became an Everton player just before the March transfer deadline

when the England Under-21 striker moved to Goodison and with Adrian Heath, scorer of 13 goals before a hamstring injury in December put him out for the remainder of the season, likely to be fit for the start of next season, there's going to be plenty of competition for places in the Goodison side's line-up when next season gets underway.

Goalkeeper Southall, skipper Kevin Ratcliffe and full-back Pat Van den Hauwe, Belgian-born, brought up in London and Welsh by choice, were all part of Wales' side that beat Spain in Wrexham last month, while Trevor Steven has started to establish himself in the England side after winning his first cap against Northern Ireland in February. Reid's call-up to Bobby Robson's end of season squad is a deserved reward for a player who has been an outstanding influence on Everton's remarkable success this season while Gray, kept out of the side by Heath's early season form, has earned a recall to the Scotland squad after playing a big part in the team's title success since Christmas.

Kendall has developed a strong squad at Goodison with players like Kevin Richardson, former Sunderland defender Ian Atkins, full-back John Bailey and ex-Liverpool reserve Alan Harper providing experienced competition for places and the manager who brought Everton out of the shadows of their Anfield neighbours and rivals has firm thoughts on how he sees the future developing for the Goodison club.

Writing in the match programme for our FA Cup semi-final game against Everton at Villa Park, Kendall commented: 'Some clubs have a peak season and then fade away.'

'We aim to build something at Everton that will last for the foreseeable future and a strong squad is all part of building a successful side for both short and long terms.'

You can take that as a warning to the rest of the League that Everton aim to stay where they are now for a good few years to come.

Although they missed out on that League-FA Cup double, Everton have emerged as the country's top team. And they intend holding on to that claim.
