## Late goals win it

leg, but Brian Stein and Meka Nwajiobi popped up with a winning double act.

First Stein scored a close range equalizer

from a Nwajiobi cross, and then Nwajiobi himself hammered a lastminute winner in off the post.

But Luton's success had not looked likely earlier, when United's star studded line-up had worked hard to create openings in the Town defence.

Colin Morris broke through but failed to beat Les Sealey with a disappointing shot, and then Sealey was forced into action again to save a diving header from the same player.

Steve Foster celebrated his 28th birthday with a good performance at the heart of the defence, but he was left flat-footed when United grabbed the lead a minute before half-time.

Ex-Liverpool captain
Phil Thompson floated a
free-kick to the near post
where Peter Withe flicked it on for Steve
Foley to head home.

The goal, coupled with a stern half-time talk from David Pleat, spurred Luton into life in the second-half.

## Celebrated

They took over the midfield and started to make openings in the home defence, but for a long time the vital goal eluded them.

David Preece, who had earlier hit the post with a low drive, was in battling mood, and Peter Nicholas provided

the driving force as Luton pushed up.

Stein and Nwajiobi always looked like making the breakthrough, and their perseverance paid off in those last dramatic minutes.
