Stein is the show stealer

ENGLAND boss Bobby Robson last night went to Selhurst Park to give the World Cup once-over on Luton centre forward Mick Harford.

But it was Brian Stein, a Robson reject after just one international against France two years ago, who launched Luton, semi-finalists last year, on another march to Wembley with a brilliant goal in the eighth minute.

He rose to meet a cross from: left back Mitchell Thomas to

guide a magnificent header wide of goalkeeper George Wood.

And Stein afterwards admitted: "I would love a second chance England. All I can do is keep scoring and keep playing well."

Stein's goal was his 14th of the season, and he has now caught up with Harford, also on 14, whose aggressive centre forward play has pushed him forward as a contender for international honours. But he was overshadowed by Crystal Palace's giant centre half Micky Droy.

Stein played superbly on a skating rink pitch in a first half display that put Luton firmly in charge.

But palace were always in there battling through front pair Andy Gray and Ian Wright.

Luton had chances to add to their score when Stein, and then Mark North went close, before David Preece got the clinching goal in the 85th minute.

There was still time for palace to make one last despairing comeback and two minutes later Kevin Taylor smashed a 20 yard shot home to give them something
