HATTERS RUN OUT OF PUFF

LUTON'S four match winning streak ended abruptly and cracked under later pressure from the super-fit Wednesday side.

Unlucky Hatters had soaked up Wednesday's pressure and threatened them on the break. But finally Megson broke their resistence when he fired in a shot through a crowded penalty area in the 72nd minute finally to beat Sealey.

Luton arrived looking to defy the history books and stretch their winning streak with a victory at Hillsborough for the first time in 16 years.

The only change on the field came with Darren Mc-Donogh drafted in to add extra bite with mid-field, and slow down the high energy Wednesday attack. Robert Wilson stepped down to the substitutes bench.

The Hatters were tested early on as Wednesday exploited space down both flanks.

Breacker had to tidy up under pressure in three minutes. Sealey and Foster were both in action to stop Wednesday in their tracks soon afterwards, as Sterland overlapped fast on the right.

Wednesday forced the first corner but Breacker did enough to head away Harwood's cross to the near post.

Luton fell prey to Wednesday's slick off-side trap as they searched for an opening. But Mark Stein caught out the defence in 14 minutes.

He collected a slight clearance but his 14th minute shot gave Hodge no trouble.

At the other end, Sealey saved comfortably from Jonsson's long range shot.

A Nicholas pass sent Brian Stein through to beat the off-side trap but as he rounded the keeper the defence recovered and hart cleared off the line from Stein's angled shot.

Foster had to head away under pressure from Chapman at the other end and Marwood out-ran Donaghy, cut the into the middle but hit his left foot shot wide.

Brian Stein messed up Luton's best chance so far when he reached Foster's through ball in 37 minutes but hit the shot wide.

In a late first half Hirst saw his shot deflected wide of the Luton goal and Chapman Wednesday's leading scoresman, went over the top with his head.
