

'Reject' Sealey has the last say

LUTON goalkeeper Les Sealey took great delight yesterday in silencing those fans who taunted him with chants of "Coventry reject".

Sealey, who walked out on Coventry when his contract expired four years ago, returned to halt his former club's march towards the first division's top six — and his enjoyment was obvious to all.

He turned cartwheels as he left the pitch at the end in a flamboyant gesture of defiance to the Coventry supporters who had greeted his return so discouragingly.

Suffered

Luton manager John Moore said: "It's always nice to come back and do well against your old club. When the fans had a go at him it geed Les up that extra bit."

Coventry midfielder Dave Philips suffered the most at the hands of the Luton 'keeper and even when the Welsh international did beat him in the 31st minute, Mal Donaghy was there to clear.

While Sealey was performing his heroics in the face of almost ceaseless Coventry pressure, Luton sneaked away to steal a 40th minute goal to pocket the points, Brian Stein cutting inside the penalty area to score from 15 yards.
