

Stein's lesson earns points

BRIAN STEIN'S clinical finishing gave Luton their first victory at Highfield Road, but manager John Moore was quick to admit they were let off the hook.

Coventry had a string of chances but failed to convert any of them, in stark contrast to their four goal display against Tottenham last week.

Moore said: 'I have never seen our defence pulled out of position so often. You have to feel a bit sorry for Coventry, but if you don't take your chances you don't deserve anything.'

Frustration

Coventry's Wales midfielder Dave Phillips personified his team's problem — he had four great opportunities but missed them all. Their frustration was increased by the fine performance of Luton keeper Les Sealey against his old club.

Sealey made several top class saves before Stein showed Coventry how it should be done in the 41st minute. He threaded a shot through a crowd of players,

Coventry captain Brian Kilcline summed up his team's feelings when he said: 'I was not impressed by Luton. We threatened to overrun them and should have won 5-1.'
