HARTLEPOOL UNITED'S F.A. Cup dream was shattered by a dominant second half performance from Luton Town this atternoon.

Andy Toman gave Pool some hope with a later goal but it proved too little too late.

There was good news for Pool before the kick-off when Rob McKinnon was ruled fit to start the game at left-back.

As expected, Tony Barratt returned to the defence with Dean Gibb adding extra weight up front, where Paul Baker and Robbie Whellans were leading the attack.

Luton were without former Manchester United utility man, Ashley Grimes, who failed a late fitness test on a suspect ankle.

With centre-forward Mick Harford out suspended, Luton shuffled the pack introducing Scottish winger Micky Weir up front.

With Luton having failed to sell their full quota of tickets, the official attendance was given as 6,056.

With the fans giving vociferous support, Pool started well winning a corner in the opening minute.

Honour's cross was met by Smith but the skipper's header was easily collected by Sealey.

Pool's first effort on goal came after 13 minutes from Gibb.

A long free kick from Haigh flicked off Foster but Gibb failed to test Sealey with a

weak shot. There were roars of disapproval on 17 minutes when Baker broke clear only for the linesman to flag late for off-

With Haigh marshalling the defence superbly, Pool were soon looking the more dangerous outfit.

There was a fine solo effort on 20 minutes when Honour curled a lovely cross in from the right and Whellans headed just wide from ten

yards. The Luton defence was

obviously rattled by the Pool pressure.

McKinnon dribbled through the Luton defence and drove a left foot shot across the face of goal only to see the ball roll tantalisingly wide.

Luton almost took the lead against the run of play after 28 minutes.

Pool pulled a goal back with just two minutes remaining when TOMAN converted from close range after a shot had deflected into his path.

But Luton were able to play out the remaining time to secure a well deserved win.
